Loadshedding tells on people

The country is currently in the grip of wide-ranging loadshedding which has been taken recourse to by the Power Development Board (PDB) owing to shortfall in the generation of power compared to its growing demand during sum-

According to the PDB, the demand during the peak hour of the current summer season was 1850 MW as against 1670 MW for the same period last year. The extent of loadshedding was reportedly 515 MW two weeks ago. Lately this has been brought down to 210 MW. The improvement has been reportedly possible owing to rehabilitation of some very old power plants done on an emergency basis. The PDB has assured that a short-term action plan has been taken up to reduce the extent of loadshed ding still further within the next five to six weeks.

The current inability to meet the increased demand for power is attributed by the PDB to several factors. A package deal for rehabilitation, overhauling, repair and maintenance of a number of power plants with 644 MW generation eapacity could not be implemented due to non-availability of committed foreign aid during the past regime. Besides, the Kaptai Hydro Electric Power Plant is now generating 50 MW against its 230 MW capacity due to fall in the water level in the wake of the current prolonged drought. There has also been a temporary shortage in the supply of gas for the power plants which accounts for a generation.

Case against US govt to stop killing of predators

WASHINGTON, May 8: Environmentalists have filed a lawsuit to force the federal government to curtail its century old practice of killing predatory animals such as coyotes on Western rangeland. The lawsuit, filed Thursday by the Sierra Club Legal Defense Fund, contends that the programme has led to the unintended deaths of endangered species, including an American bald eagle, reports UNB.

From Page | Col 7 Banking Order further strengthens the hands of the central bank and, what's more, underscores a punishable offence that might be committed by a finance company.

The said article provides that "if any non-banking institution receives any deposit in contravention of any direction or instruction given to it under Chapter V, then every director or member of the committee or other body for the time being vested with the management of such institution shall be punishable to fine ... twice the amount of the deposit received." In such a situation, the only defence of an offending director or any other officer of the finance company in question can only be that the alleged contravention took place without his knowledge or that he exercised "due diligence" to prevent it."

What should BB do when it unearths any such irregularity in any finance company, as it surely did in the case of BCI more than two years ago?

The lawyer quotes Article 57 which "provides that such complaint can be made before the Court of Magistrate, First Class by an officer of Bangladesh Bank duly authorised.

According to the lawyer, the central bank did not deal with BCI under Article 57. even after it had issued BCD Circular No 14 dated July 4, 1989 providing certain specific instructions to BCI. These instructions, inter alia, provided that: First, no baking company shall borrow monetes aggregating to more than 20 times of its paid up capital and general reserves; secondly, borrowing in each case shall not be less than Tk five

ment company shall maintain liquid assets in the shape of deposits with a scheduled commercial bank or unencumbered approved securities equivalent at least to ten per cent of its aggregate liabilities.

Having reached the conclusion, probably on the basis of information supplied by BB, that BCI had "contravened or failed to comply with the above instructions", the lawyer advised the central bank in his note of May, 1990 that it could decide whether to file a complaint before the Court of Magistrate or not. "In the alternative", the note from the lawyer said, "without giving any show cause notice, Bangladesh Bank can directly file complaint against BCI before the Court of Magistrate, First Class, for violating the directions."

The same note from the lawyer also referred to the fact that BCI, a public limited company, was guilty of giving loans to the directors in contravention of the Article 52 of the Article of Association. "If this provision is contravened, then such director is liable to be punished under sub-section (2) of section 86D of the

Companies Act, 1913. The note from the lawyer, one of the best in Bangladesh, covered all the legal angles relating to the operation of BCI and the responsibilities and powers of the central bank. The irony of it is the advice of the lawyer, which was in response to a high official of the Bangladesh Bank, two years ago, apparently went unheeded by the authorities concerned.

With no BB officials available over the weekend to offer any explanation for the organisation's position on the lawyer's advice, one can only conclude that the central bank was guilty of negligence for which some 50,000 depositors of BCI, including many public corporations, and the country as a whole have paid a heavy
