Different political parties of the country condemned Friday's attack on the biennial council of Bangladesh Chhatra Leagues (BCL) Fatikehhari unit that left three people dead, and demanded of the government to give exemplary punishment to those involved with the killing.

The political parties also called upon the people to unitedly resist the political forces which actively opposed the country's war of independence and are now engaged in killing the pro-liberation forces.

Awami League (AL) chief Sheikh Hasina, in a statement issued to the press yesterday, said that the identified antiliberation forces unleashed an armed attack on the BCL council at Fatikchhari on Friday when the AL and BCL workers had just begun to offer gaebana janaza prayer for a local AL leader. Obaidul Haque, who died in a recent road mishap.

Expressing strong resentment over the incident, the Al chief said that the brutal attack , jointly led by the armed cadres of Jamaat and NDP, left Harun Bashar of the Bhotpur unit of AL, and Jamiruddin and Abu Ahmed of the Fatikchhari untt of BCL dead and a number of BCL activists injured.

The AL chief also slated the local police for remaining silent even after the incident despite repeated appeals by the AL leaders for their (police) intervention.

Sheikh Hasina said that the polices indifference towards such a brutal attack on the democratic forces, especially when the whole nation was united in demand of trying Jamaat chief Golam Azam as a war criminal, virtually proved

the government's involvement

The Hasanul Haque Inu-led faction of the Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (JSD), in a separate statement, expressed its resentment over the Jamaat attack on the BCL council and demanded of the government to try the killers.

Hasanul Haque Inu said in his statement that if the government failed to take legal action against the anti-liberation forces resorting to attacking pro-liberation forces, the people would not let these attacks go unchallenged.

Bangladesher The Communist Party (CPB) also condemned the Jamaat attack on the BCL council at Fatikchhari.

The CPB presidium, in a statement issued to the press yesterday, expressed deep concern over the incident and strongly demanded of the government to take 'necessary steps' against the attackers.

Our Khulna correspondent adds: The Awami League backed Chhatra League brought out a procession in the city yesterday, protesting the killing of its members at Fatikchhari on Friday.

Parading the city thoroughfares, the BCL activists chanted slogans demanding the arrest of those responsible for the killing.

The KL Declaration which

was adopted unanimously one day ahead of schedule, urged the developed nations to change their production, consumption and distribution patterns if sustainable development is to be achieved. The declaration stressed that development was the fundamental right of all countries and that it was urgent to eradicate poverty. It said that a supportive international economic environment must be created to achieve environmentally sound development. This would include the transfer of environmentally-sound technology as well as new and additional financial resources to developing countries through specific mechanism.

"The funding mechanism must be transparent, account able and the decision making must have equal representation" the declaration said adding, "developed countries should not impose restrictions on international trade based on environmental grounds."

The declaration hints of a cooperative stance as it does not discount the possibility of

the Global Environment Facility (GEF) being the funding mechanism so long it is modified, reformed and restructured to meet the set cri-

The GEF was created by the developed nations to finance sustainable development in Third World countries through the World Bank. China and developing nations under the G-77 umbrella contend that the existing mechanism under the World Bank are dominated by developed countries and are undemocratic and not trans-

Developed countries look at the Kuala Lumpur Declaration with some reservations. Director of US UNCED Robert Ryan believed that the strong stand taken at the KL meeting would not hurt further negotiation between developing and developed countries on envi ronment and development is sues. He however said that Washignton would maintain its stand of not favouring a separate fund to finance sustainable development other than using the existing mechanism in cluding GEF

Most experts look at the KL conference with mixed feelings. While it has certainly put the focus on the demands of developing world, it has failed to create a broad based consensus on the complex linkage between environment and development. Whether the Rio Conference can achieve this remains to be seen.

Fatikchhari killing Jamaat denies

Jamaat-e-Islam yesterday termed "false and fabricated" the report of Jamaat-Shibir involvement in Friday's killing at Fatikchhari and appealed for restraining from dishing out such 'provocating falsehood,' reports UNB.

In a statement, Jamaat Organising Secretary Abdul Kader Mollah said Jamaat-Shibir activities remained suspended in Fatikchhart following a party decision to avoid clashes with Awami League-Chhatra League in which 14 of their workers lost lives.

He condemned and protested the report involving amaat Shibir activists in Fatikchhari killing published in a section of the press.
