


283 ganja plants seized at Gazipur

Enayetullah Khan was highly critical of the imposition of various conditionalities like elimination of tariff by the donor countries while sanctioning loans under industrial Sector Adjustment Credit (ISAC) and said that accepting such conditions would suicidal for private enterprises.

Jatiya Party Leader Barrister Moudud Ahmed stressed the need for political commitment to streamline the private industrial sector of the country and suggested that specified guidelines should be made to implement the policies like
