



Reynolds to take legal action



World 400 meters record holder Butch Reynolds is consi dering immediate

legal action to overturn a twoyear ban for doping which will keep him out of the Barcelona Olympics, reports Reuter.

The 27-year-old America checked out of his London hotel on Tuesday Morning to catch a flight home after the International Amateur Athletic Federation's (IAAF) arbitration panel confirmed the suspension imposed from August 12.

"Right now I'm going back to the States and I'm going to talk to my attorney about what can do," Reynolds told reporters. "I feel more determined than ever."

Arbitration panel president Lauri Tarasti told a news conference on Monday the panel could find no doubts about the reliability of a positive dope test for the banned anabolic steroid Nandrolone at a meeting in Monaco.

The decision dismayed lawyers from the American government body, the Athletics Congress, who al
