JCD BUET unit resigns

BNP patronizing armed hooligans'

All leaders of Jattyatabadi Chhaira Dal (JCD) BUET unit including the leaders of all hall units resigned en masse protesting what they termed for showing irreverence and negligence to the departed souls of three BUET students including EUCSU VP Mir Ruhul Kabir," who were drowned in a boat-capsize in river Buriganga on May 14.

In a statement the leaders Monday bitterly criticised the central BNP and JCD leaders for not attending the namaz-ejanaja and the condolence meeting for the deceased. They pointed out that the BNP leader were patronizing the armed hooligans instead of the potentials. They also condemned that BNP leaders ar ranged for a helicopter for sending the dead body of Mirza Galeeb, an armed cadre but shown negligence in case of EUCSU VP Ruhul Kabir.

The leaders also said that Engineering University was the first to present JCD a VP in university level and influenced the whole student community a lot in bringing JCD to such a position. "But instead they even didn't bother to pay a little respect to Ruhul Kabir and two other JCD

workers. Shovon and Arif' said the President of JCD BUET unit, Jahangir Alam.

Ruhul Kabir, a brilliant student secured first position in the combined merit list under Rajshahi Board in both the SSC and HSC examinations held in 1983 and 1985 respectively.

The leaders said that they upheld the ideals of late President Ziaur Rahman and never encouraged terrorism. But this time they had to decide to resign in a ground to pay homage to the departed souls of the deceased who were the exemplary identities of all the student leaders and BNP ought to the proud of a brilliant student leader like Ruhul Kabtr.

Earlier, DUCSU AGS Nazimuddin Alam came in the BUET campus to express sympathy and to donate Taka 10,000 for the Qulkhawant of the deceased students. But the students refused to receive the money and rebuked him and the central leaders for showing negligence. At one stage the agitated students made Alam run off the campus. Two crackers were blasted following the incident, but none was reported to be injured.

Country's image will be tarnished if rule of law denied: Mustafiz

Forcign Minister ASM Mustafizur Rahman, yesterday urged all to show respects to the rule of law for maintaining peace, progress, stability and democracy, reports BSS. He was addressing as chief

guest a rally of the "Soldiers of Zia" who participated in the anti-autocracy movement of 1990, here yesterday afternoon at the Dhanmondi Club Ground. Education Minister Jamiruddin Strear and DUCSU Vice President Amanullah Aman MP also spoke on the occasion. Former student leader Jamal Sharif Hiru presided.

Pleading for the stabilization of the rule of law in the country, the Foreign Minister said, even during the anti-autocracy movement of 1990 we had not taken laws in our own hands. We have shown respects to the courts of law and did not try Ershad and his associates in the so-called peoples court, he said, adding, we also wanted the trial of Professor Golam Azam but maintained that it should be held in the court, not in the so-called people's court.

Bangladesh's image would be tarnished if we could not show respects to law, he said, adding, internationally we had earned reputation as a nation for our peaceful anti-autocracy movement and people's upsurge of 1990.

Blaming a political party for

playing a dubious role, he said this political party did not raise the Golam Azam issue in 1979 Parliament. This party even took part in the controversial Parliamentary Election of 1986 with the Jamaat-e-Islami and kept silence on the Golam Azam issue. Why this party is now raising this issue after 20 years of independence, he asked.

The Foreign Minister said this political party had no political issue now at hand and was trying to be on the streets using the so-called people court initiators as ladders. But people would foil their
