

Barcelona finally stepped out of the shadow cast Real Madrid when they won

the European Cup here on Wednesday after a memorable final against Sampdoria of Italy, reports AFP.

A stunning goal from their outstanding Dutch defender Ronald Koeman in the 111th minute settled the outcome just when it looked as if the match would go to a penalty shoot-out.

"It's fantastic," said Koeman. "Hitting freekicks is one of my qualities as a player but I think this was the most important one of my life.

Sampdoria will probably claim they were unfairly pc nalised by German referee.

It is 26 years since Real Madrid won the last of their six European Cups but Catalan pride has found it hard to put up with second-best fibes.

Barcelona coach Johan Cruyff, who had a triple bypass heart operation last year, won the first of his three European Cups as a player with Ajax Amsterdam here in 1971 but he refused to compare the two achievements.

The Dutchman was report-

edly on a personal winning bonus of half a million pounds.

It was Sampdoria's first European Cup final. They had lost to Barcelona in the European Cup Winners' Cup final in 1989 although they went on to win that trophy the following year.

A crowd of 70,827 which included 20,000 Spanish fans, watched the match.

Cruyff called man-of-thematch Koeman a "coach's dream." He was the hub of many of Barcelona's intricate passing moves although the fiercely combative Stoichkov and Danish forward Michael Laudrup's fluid running helped unlock a tight Italian defence.

It was the best final since Rudd Gullit's AC Milan destroyed Steaua Bucharest in 1989. Gullit, a Dutchman playing for an Italian side, masterminded that win in Barcelona of all places.

This Wembley triumph allowed Spanish clubs to draw level at seven wins apiece with Italian sides.

And Barcelona joined Ajax and Juventus as the only sides to have won all three European competitions. Ajax achieved that feat last week by beating Torino in the UEFA Cup final last week.

Forget dents Edberg's morale

DUESSELDORF, May 21: Stefan Edberg's preparations for next week's French Open suffered a further setback on Wednesday when he was beaten 7-5, 6-4 by Guy Forget at the men's World Team Cup, reports Reuter.

The Swedish world number two, who tasted defeat by Spanish clay-court specialist Emilio Sanchez in his opening match on Monday, fatled to get his serve-and-volley game into top gear in the opening rubber of Sweden's clash with France.

But Sweden, the defending champions, levelled the round robin group match to 1when Magnus Gustafsson beat Oliver Delaitre 6-3, 7-5 in the second singles, keeping alive the country's hopes of staying in the competition.

Edberg, who refuses to abandon his strong serve-andvolley game on the slow clay although it is best suited to faster surfaces, won his first tournament on clay for six years at the German Open earlier this month.

But he was not at his best as the Swedes lost the opening tie against Spain. The winners from the two four-nation groups qualify for Sunday's fi-

The evergreen Antiguan batsman scored the 112th century of his career off 113 balls as Glamorgan compiled 346 for five against Warwickshire at Swansea.


