Setting up of homeo hospitals underscored

Deputy Leader of the House in Parliament Dr Badruddoza Chowdhury Sunday said the present government is determined to develop the homeopathic system of medicine to reach medical treatment at low cost to the commonman, reports UNB.

Dr Chowdhury was talking to a delegation of Homeo Professional Association and Homeo Medical Chhatra Oikya who met him at his official residence Sunday morning.

He underscored the need for setting up homeo hospitals and laboratories alongside development of allopathic treatment. In this context, Dr Chowdhury referred to the Government Degree Homeopathy Medical College and Hospital at Mirpur, which was founded by the BNP government in 1981.

During the meeting, the delegation members handed over to Dr Chowdhury a memorandum containing 10-point demand of the homeo students, says a press release.

The demands include appointment of homeo physicians in the Health Services, provision of welfare allowance to homeo teachers and employees, making DHMS course equivalent to B.Sc. (Science) and setting up of separate Homeopathy Directorate and Council.

Dr Abdur Rashid Talukdar led the delegation which included Principal Dr AKM Yunus Khan, Amanullah Ziku, Obaidul Haq Khan, Dr Mantu Sarker, Dr Nazrul Islam, Dr Abdul Aziz Bhutyan, Altaf Hossain, and Enayetur Rahman Bhutyan.

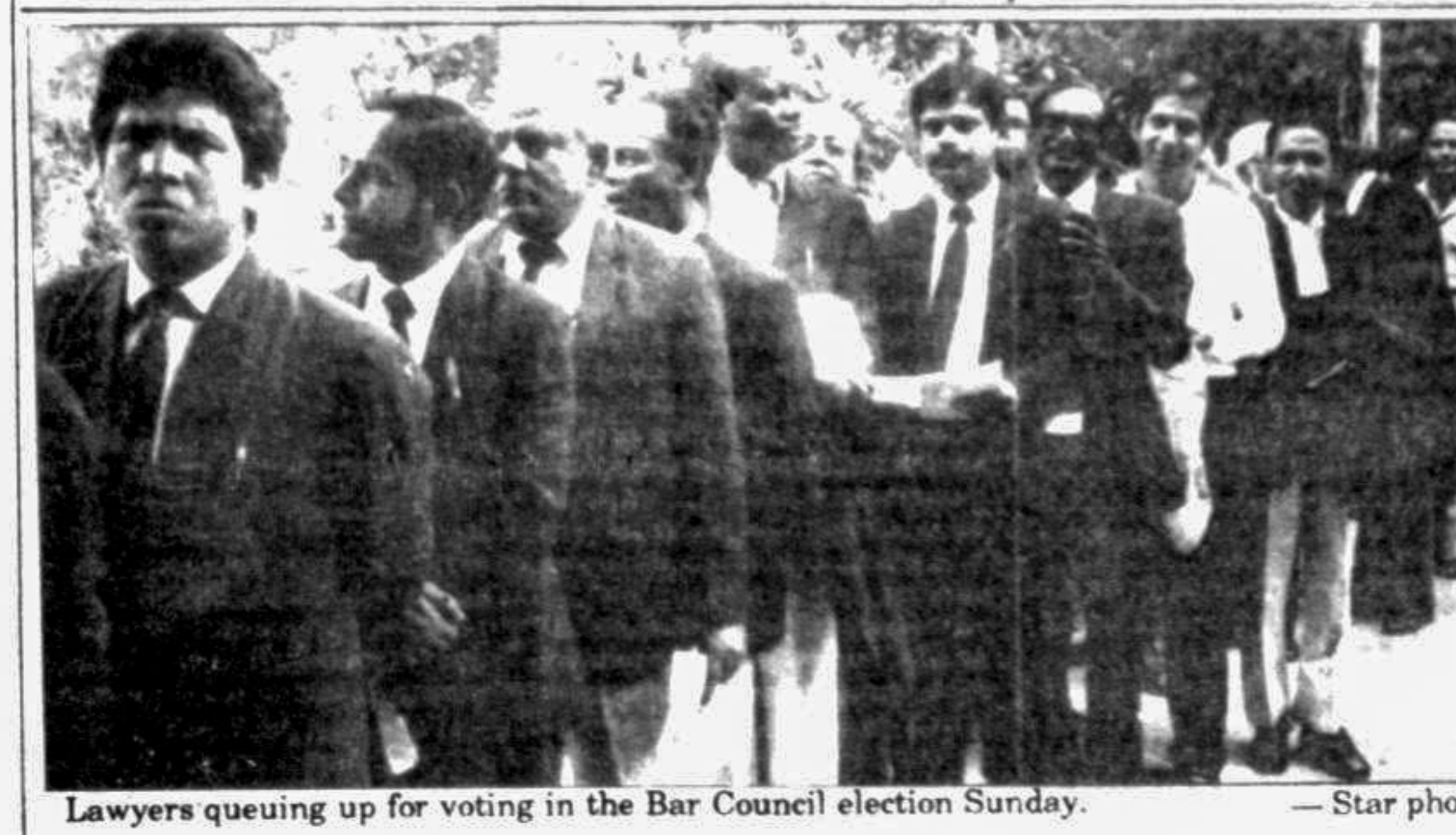
Besides, the B.Sc. Agri. Engg. (Hons) final examination for the same year will start from June 8 and July 1 respectively.

The leaders urged the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Bangladesh to take up the matter and help release them.

'Independence to be at stake without unity'
