Sohail's injury adds to Pak woes

LEICESTER, May 26: Opener Aamir Sohail added to the Pakistan cricket team's mounting injury problems when he twisted a knee while fielding against Leicestershire on Monday, reports Reuter.

Aamir's injury tempered the touring team's delight at their eight-wicket victory on the third and final day.

The Pakistani batsman limped from the field after he was struck by a ball and may be doubtful for the first Test against England at Edgbaston starting on June 4.

Aamtr was taken by ambulance to hospital in Leicester and later returned to the ground on crutches.

Tour manager Intikhab Alam said: "He has a badly twisted knee but we will have to wait two days until he sees a specialist before we know whether there is any ligament damage."

Aamir is the third casualty in the squad. Wagar Younis is recovering from a stress fracture of the back and has yet to play a tour match while fellow paceman Wasim Akram has been out of action since last Friday with an ankle stress




