Six exhibitors, most of them new-comers to the Cologne fair, introduced a range of shirts, T-shirts, trousers, jackets, jogging suits an knitwear to the trade visitors who visited the country's

Bangladesh decided to return to the world's largest trade fair for menswear, jeans, casualwear and young fashions because of its growing impor-

tance as a forum for promoting the country's garments in Germany and other leading world markets, says Atique Ullah, Deputy Director of the Export Promotion Bureau. Bangladesh is hoping to expand the sales of its garments in the German market benefiting from the increased demand for these items since the German unification.

Atique Ullah feels that his country is in a position to supply range of cotton garments at a competitive price to suit the requirements of the consumers in the five new German states.

Germany's imports of menswear increased by 21 per cent to DM 3,911.5 million during the ten months of last year from the level of the corresponding period in 1990 even though the domestic menswear industry achieved only a very modest growth in its sales turnover, according to

Atique Ullah said the expectations of Bangladesh's participant have been met to a great extent. They received a number of export inquiries and at least some of them are expected to result in export orders. Potential buyers came not only from Germany, but also from the United States, Canada, Britain and other countries in Europe. The participation also helped Bangladeshi exhibitors to establish contacts with importers from many countries and to get an idea about the fashion trends for menswear in


the coming years. The Federal Republic of Germany is the largest market for Bangladesh's garments in the European Community. During 1990-91, Bangladesh's garment exports to this country increased to 31.7 million dollar from 4.46 million dollar in 1989/90 according to the

The high standard of production and sophistication achieved by Bangladesh's gar ment industry and the coun try's improved marketing efforts, including trade fair participation, have contributed to this impressive growth in the country's garment exports to Germany, Atique Ullah said.

Bangladesh's participation in the spring show of the International Menswear Fair was also in preparation for the single European market, scheduled to become operational at the end of this year.

The European Community is at present the second largest importer of garments from Bangladesh after the United States.

More than 1,470 exhibitors from 38 countries presented their menswear collections for the next autumn and winter season at the three-day fair. "Fashion on Top," featuring outstanding fashion creations from 230 suppliers and a series of other fashion shows were among the main attractions at the fair.

A sudden hey-day for brokers

Stockbrokers witnessed a hey-day on Wednesday at Dhaka Stock Exchange (DSE). Nineteen stocks were traded on the day. Of them, 11 gained and most of them substantially, only two shed prices while six changed hands at their previously quoted rates.

The day's turnovers, both in value and volume, rose remarkably. Trading in value rose from Tuesday's Tk 1,312,145 to Tk 2,611,295, a 199.01 pre cent jump. Turnover in volume increased similarly, registering a 167.18 per cent rise to stand at 45,054 papers.

The bullish fervour was also reflected in the DSE Composite Index which jumped to 303.0021 from Tuesday 301.9544.

Malaysia plans manhunt for illegal workers KUALA LUMPUR, June 3: Malaysia will spend 10 million.

An estimated 300,000 illegal immigrants, mostly Indonesians, have until the end of June to register with Malaysian authorities and obtain work permits.

"This is not to say we don't want aliens to come but we want them to come in a proper manner.... we don't want unknown or people without any background to stay in the country, Megat Junid said.

Iran hopes to find new oil, gas reserves thru' satellite pictures

NICOSIA, June 3: Iran hopes to find new oil and gas reserves by using satellite pic tures in addition to exploratory drilling, the Iranian news agency IRNA quoted an official as saying on Monday, reports Reuter.

Ali Moshtagian, Exploration and Production Director of the National Iranian Oil Company said Iran would soon drill a second well in the Caspian Sca after a first well indicated the existence of gas reserves.

"Our northern neighbours have dug 7,000 wells in the northern part of the Caspian Sea and we should dig at least 10 exploratory wells to find out our exact resources there."

IRNA quoted him as saying. He said Iran had been using pictures taken by a Frenchmade satellite of 200,000 sq km (80,000 sq miles) of west ern Iran, including the main off region of Khuzestan, since last year.
