Star poultry farm case

Ershad waived interest for partyman: PP

The hearing of the charge against former President H M Ershad for his alleged misusc of power in waiving bank interest to the tune of Taka 35 lakh in favour of a poultry farm owned by a Jatiya Party man was deferred on a prayer of the defence, reports BSS.

The special court headed by Judge Mohammad Ali, fixed June 18 the exact date of the

Former President Ershad and five others including former industries secretary A K M Mosharraf Hossain are accused in this case.

All the accused including Feroze Kabir, one of the directors of the Three Star Poultry Farm at Savar and a JP stalwart in the area were in court. Kabir, still in detention, was produced before the court.

Ramzan Ali, defence lawyer for Feroze Kabir, prayed for the bail of his client and the court granted the appeal against a bond of Taka two

Public prosecutor Abdur Razzak Khan while dwelling on

the case said the former President Ershad to benefit his partyman Firoze Kabir had waived interest of Taka 35 lakh which was due to Bangladesh Shilpa Bank against its lending to the Three Star poultry. The former President ordered the relief of interest without investigating the case and also in complete disregard to the legal steps taken by the BSB against Three Start poul try farm thus depriving the state exchequer of the re-

Ramzan Ali claimed that there was no evidence that his client (Firoze Kabir) ever prayed for any relief, nor was he mentioned in 161 (statement made before). Besides, the farm is continuing to pay instalments to the banks regularly as was settled earlier.

Earlier, the defence lawyers drew the attention of the court about the difficulties they were facing in procuring security passes to attend the court. The court asked prosecution to take necessary measures to meet the demand.

ronment. The Prime Minister referred to continued pressure on the resources in the already over-populated world and pointed out that the main reason of environment degradation was unequal distribution wealth resulting in widespread poverty.

The Prime Minister said only 25 per cent of the world population live in the developed countries who enjoy more than 80 per cent of the global resources. She mentioned that a child of developed country had food equivalent to that of 125 children of the developing countries. Begum Zia said the environment was at stake to support the luxurious life of the developed countries.

Begum Zia hoped that the Earth Summit being held in Brazil would make valuable contribution to establishing unbiased international economic system for the human race including rich and poor.

The Prime Minister described environment as a national issue and called for united approach on this national issue irrespective of party, opinion and position. She called upon all political parties to incorporate the programme of environment preservation in their party activities. She said there was no scope of debate or opposition where the existence of the entire nation was in question.

The Prime Minister said, "We have adopted a policy to attach environment with development," poverty alleviation had been given priority and population boom had been identified as number one problem, she added.

Begum Zia said the government had taken some posttive steps for preservation and development of environment.

She said recently the national environment policy and pragmatic programmes related to environment preservation had been approved. She said the major objective of this policy was to maintain the ecological balance of the country through protection and devel opment of the environment and ensuring the uplift suiting the environment.

She said the formulation of the national preservation poltcy and a working plan for national environment was at the final stage, necessary amendments are being made in the laws of the environment of the country. She said, "We have restarted the canal digging programme for maintaining ecological balance."

The Prime Minister said the use of natural resources suiting the environment had to be ensured. She said we have to be more cautious regarding dire consequences before the problem of the environmental degradation became more complicated. She also underlined the need for involving the woman community in the environment preservation programmes. She said the afforestation programme had to be undertaken as a strong tool to safeguard ecological balance She said the work for creating a green belt in the coastal area had to be carried forward.

Begum Zia called upon all to take the tree plantation programme as a mission and spread it in every nook and corner of the country. She said there was no alternative to trees for making the environment beautiful and rich.


