

Dry weather is likely to prevail elsewhere over the country during the period.

On Tuesday Chittagong experienced the highest 42 mm of rain in 12 hours till 6 pm which was followed by Maijdicourt 33 mm, Rangamati 24 mm, Kutubdia 13 mm, Satkhira 3 mm and Srimangal 2 mm.
