Russian mantle is at stake



MANILA, June 10: The proud Russian chess squad, heirs to glorious Soviet teams that ruled

the Chess Olympiad for decades, face a bruising battle to retain their title against powerful rivals England, the Ukraine and the United States, reports Reuter. The absence of ex-World

Champion Anatoly Karpov and Arthur Yusupov has weakend the Russians but they are still tough to beat in the Manila World Olympiad, opposing Grandmasters said.

This time the English team has a good chance to win the Chess Olympiad but it will be, a big fight between England, Russia, the Ukraine and USA," said world champion Garri Kasparov, who leads the depleted Russian squad.

They may be weakened by the loss of strong players but they are still formidable," said British Grandmaster Nigel Short, who beat Karpov to qualify for the finals of the Candidates' Series to choose the challenger for the world ti-

"We have a good chance this year, I think the team is better

prepared this time," added Short, who will face Dutchman Jan Timman in a match in January to choose who will challenge Kasparov for the world crown.

After two rounds of play, Russia leads the Manila competition with 7.5 points with England and six other countries tied for second place half a point behind.

The loss of two of their key players might spur the Russians to work harder in the 14-round tournament and the battle for the top spot may be the most closely-fought in 70 years, short said.

"Their mantle is on the line," a member of the England Karpov skipped the Manila

competition supposedly because he was bitterly disappointed by his loss to Short in Linares, Spain a few months

"Mr. Karpov has indicated he is very busy while Mr Yusupov asked for steep requirements that the Russian Chess Federation cannot meet," Kasparov told reporters.

The England team — which includes Short, Jonathan Speelman, Michael Adams,

Murray Chandler, John Nunn and Julian Hodgson-has been together for years, creating a solid team spirit needed in the long contest for top honours. "England has the same

players. They know each other very well. They have this team spirit which sets them apart from most teams," said Timman.

Another solid contender is the United States, which finished second behind the Russians in the 1990 Olympiad in Novisad in Yugoslavia.

Powered by three Soviet emigres - youthful prodigy Gata Kamsky, Alexander Yermolinsky and Boris Gulko -the US team hopes to topple the Russians from the top perch when the tournament ends on June 25.

Another serious challenger will be the Ukraine, led by world number three Vassily Invachuk and two other stalwarts of the former Soviet squad, Oleg Romanishin and Alexander Beliavsky.


