Erosion renders hundreds homeless in Sylhet, Kushtia dists

SYLHET, June 14: Vast area of land in four upazilas of the district have already been eroded by the river Kushiyara.

The erosion of the river has taken a serious turn during the last few weeks and hundreds of houses, religious and educational institutions in Nabiganj, Balaganj, Jagannathpur, and Biswanath upazilas are now threatened by the erosion.

Several hundred houses have been devoured by the river recently. Over zoo shops and one road of Sherpur Bazar have already been devoured by the river Kushiyara.

Extensive loss of property have been caused by the erosion at Aloypur, Baghmaina, Sulikona, Pailgaon and Raniganj bazar areas of Jagannathpur Upazila. More than 300 shops in Raniganj Bazar have been devoured by the river.
