The nucleus of the Bangladesh batting will certainly be Mohammedan Sporting captain Minhazul Abedin Nannu who will bat at number four. Experienced bespectacled Mohammedan opener Azhar Hossain Shantu will most likely open along with aggressive Zahid Razzak Masum, the gangling Abahani opener. Athar Ali Khan, the Brothers Union captain, will probably come at number three. Nannu will be followed by in-form Abahani batsman Akram Khan who had a great season at home. Aminul Islam Bulbul of Mohammedans and Enamul Huq Moni, the Biman southpaw will be the automatic choices as allrounders.

Mahbubur Rahman Selim. the right-handed Abahani batsman is likely to make it to the first eleven ahead of Rafiqui Alam, Farouque Ahmed. Selim Shahed and Shahnawaz Shanu for his smart fielding and the ability to bowl accurate right arm leg-spinner. 
