# 3 killed, 31 hurt in separate incidents

At least three persons were killed and another thirty-one injured in separate incidents in and outside the city during the last two days.

A 60-year old pedestrian, was killed as a speeding private car ran over him at Shawrapara in the city at around 2:30 pm Monday.

The victim Hazrat Ali was rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where he succumbed to injuries at around 4:30 pm .

A businessman, Abdul Malek Hawladar, 42, was killed as a minibus ran over him on the Airport Road Sunday night.

Seriously injured Abdul Malek was taken to the DMCH, but he died immediately after being admitted to the hospital on the same night.

Kayes Ahmed, 45, a teacher of Bangla of Willes Little Flowers School, reportedly committed suicide by hanging at his residence at Dinonath Sen Road Sunday afternoon.

Sutrapur police said, on an information, they rushed to the spot in the evening and recovered the body by breaking open the door of the victim's bed room. The body was found hanging from the ceiling

fan of the room, police added. Kayes Ahmed's wife and only son were absent from the house during the incident, according to police.

A young man, Noor Mohammad, 18, was severely stabbed near Malibag Bazar Sunday night and admitted to the Sabujbag police said, Noor

Mohammad was stabbed following a quarrel between two groups of the area. Police rushed to the spot but are yet to arrest any one in this connection.

Our Jhenidah correspondent adds: At least thirty persons were injured in a road accident at Kagmari on Kaliganj Chuadanga road in Kotchandpur thana Monday noon.

Police and eyewitnesses said the accident occurred when a Khulna- bound speedy bus (Meherpur Ba-4) having lost control plunged into a road side ditch.

## 8000 held in Tamil Nadu ahead of strike

NEW DELHI, June 15: Police have rounded up some 8,000 people in India's Tamil Nadu state ahead of a planned nationwide strike to protest the federal government's economic policies, the Press Trust of India (PTI) said Sunday, reports AFP.

The people taken into custody as "a precaution" in the southern state included activists of the Communist Party of India-Marxist (CPI-M), the chief sponsor of the strike,

Activists of the centrist Janata Dal and two regional parties, including, Tamil Nadu's main opposition Tamil Party, Dravid Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK), were among

those detained. Around 800 of the detainees were taken into custody in Tamil Nadu's textile town of Coimbatore. There were no reports of any vio-

lence. The state government in Tamil Nadu is controlled by rival Tamti Party All India Anna DMK, an ally of Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao's ruling Congress [I] Party.

## BJC chief blames past govts for present crisis

The officials and employees of the Bangladesh Jute Corporation (BJC) have alleged that previous governments were fully responsible for the present crisis in the Corporation and said that it was possible to make the BJC profitable if government interference was withdrawn.

"We just carried out gov ernment orders and sometimes purchased jute at double the market price for the farmers' welfare causing huge losses to the BJC," Chairman of the BJC Col (Retd) M Shariful Islam said on behalf of the employees.

In an interview with The Daily Star he said that the BJC started operation in 1985 with a backlog of Taka 204 crore loss sustained by five similar organisations which were then merged into BJC.

The losses have swelled because of the bank interests and added with subsequent losses which now stand at about Taka 1105 crore, the source said He added that of this the actual loss was only Taka 208 crore while Taka 897 crore

was is bank interest. He pointed out some other causes of losses like the purchasing of jute at subsidised rate, selling out of jute at discount prices and supplying of jute to the Bangladesh Jute Mills Corporation (BJMC) without settling the price. There were also some political and socio-economic reasons

behind the losses, he added. The BJMC still owed Tk 35 crore to the BJC, the Chairman

added. "All we have done were on government orders and were never asked to do business with jute," the official said adding, "We can accept the

challenge to make the BJC a profitable organisation if we are allowed to compete in the market.

Citing an example of the year 1985-86, the official said that the jute price had fallen to Taka 90 per maund because of a bumper production but the government ordered the Corporation to buy jute at Taka 200 per maund to help the

Normally the BJC purchases 25 lakh maunds of jute but that year it had to buy one crore 24 lakh maunds, he added.

He said that the Corporation was established with the aims and objectives of ensuring fair prices to the growers. stabilising local and foreign markets, checking smuggling and maintaining quality of jute.

The Chairman said that during formation of BJC it was said that the backlog loss would be waived and that the BJC would start as a new organisation without any previous liabilities. But the authorities did not do so.

The official said that it would be "very unfair" if the authorities went ahead with the move to squeeze the Corporation pushing 2,700

employees out of jobs. "We raised the matter at a meeting of the Parliamentary Standing Committee and requested to review it," the official said adding, "We suggested waiving bank interests and segregate the losses to salvage BJC and make it a profitable organisation."

The BJC official said that this year the Corporation sought Taka 105 crore to purchase jute in the coming season which remained pending with the government.

their key export. The Earth Summit also produced Agenda 21, weighty 800 pages designed as a blueprint for lasting environment-friendly development - and ways to fund it - into

the 21st century. The text lays down courses of action to protect the earth's atmosphere from greenhouse gases, to protect the ozone layer, to slow deforestation and ensure better management of forests, and to stop erosion of arable land, desertification and

Agenda 21 also lays down the broad lines of a programme to protect the oceans, marine resources and coastal

It stresses the need to protect fresh water and manage it better to curb transmission of diseases, and to treat dangerous nuclear and toxic waste.

But the area where Agenda 21 is already straining at the seams is the section which sets up a system to finance all this - with the United Nations estimating a cost of some 125 billion dollars a year until the end of the decade. Total public development

aid has hitherto been running at 55 billion dollars a year. The United Nations was seeking a pledge from developed countries to boost their international development aid

National Product, but few answered the call.

France and Germany have promised to reach the 0.7 per cent level as soon as possible, while it was left up to other countries when and if they will reach the target.

Third World efforts to have the year 2000 inserted as a target-date for that percentage foundered in the final compromise, leaving nothing but a reference to the fact that some developed nations were committed to it.

One Third World delegates pointed out during the course of the conference that decisions taken by consensus among 178 widely disparate countries would inevitably be "all things to all men" compromises, but the delegates were unanimous in saying the summit had raised awareness of environmental issues among government leaders as well as the global public.

The deliberations here were transmitted to the world by 9,000 journalists - more than twice the number at any previous UN meeting. Thousands of members of action groups - all voters in their home countries - arrived in Rio to lobby the national delegations. Many of them condemned the outcome of the conference, with friends of the earth slamming the North's "irresponsibility" and "short-term economic expediency" but at the same time acknowledging "important progress."
