Each and every beel, haor, pond, tank and marshy land in the district was once rich in lily. But lily is decaying and its production is now scanty in these beels, haors and ponds.

It may be mentioned here that lily creeper is used as vegetables in the wake of vegctable crisis in the rainy sea son. Its food value is not in any way less than any others vegctables. The food value is more than beet, radish, bean, cabbage and cauliflower, it is learnt.

The ripe seeds of lily is used to make fried grain (khof) which commonly termed by the villagers as "Dhyaper Khoi" But now-a-days, Dhyaper Khoi has disappeared from the village markets.

Knowledgeable circles opined that it was the duty of all concerned to increase the lily production at any cost because of its importance in our economic and social life.
