2 party activists murdered

JHENIDAH, June 21: Two political activists were murdered by rivals in the town and in Shailkupa upazila on Saturday, police said, reports

Jattyatabadi Jubo Dal activist Mahbubur Rahman (18) was stabbed to death by, what witnesses said, some armed youths near Chuadanga bus stand of the town Saturday

Mahbub was chased and caught by his assailants around 10-30 pm. He was stabbed to death on the spot.

Local political sources attributed the incident as a sequel to intra-party rivalry in the Jubo Dal.

In another incident. Sukumar Das (30) of village Tribeni in Shailkupa upazila was slaughtered by unidentified political rivals late Saturday night, police said.

Sukumar, said to be a member of outlawed Bangladesher Biplobi Communist Party, was called out of his house by an armed group who later slaughtered him.

Police, who recovered the body from a nearby beel this morning, said the murder may have resulted from political disagreement.

Villagers kill Shibir activist in Rangpur

RANGPUR, June 21: A Shibir activist was killed and three others were injured crit ically in a clash with villagers in Sadar upazila this evening, reports UNB.

Witnesses said Mansur Ali, second year student of Islamic History of Carmichael College, and three others were seriously injured in the clash at Chakertari village at around 6

Mansur was declared dead by the attending physicians after he was rushed to the Rangpur Medical College .Hospital(RMCH).

Afzal Hossain (45) and Kalam(50), both farmers of the village, and Jamaat worker Hafizur (35) were admitted to RMCH in critical condition.

Remarks informal, AL clarifies



Police storm National Press Club, assault journalists

From Page 1 Col 5 At the portico, the police with heavy sticks battered the motorbikes and screamed "Come out you bastard journal-

About hundred people were injured out side the club premises as the police batoncharged indiscriminately and lobbed teargas shells on virtually anything that moved on the crowded Topkhana Road.

Suffocated journalists began running for life inside the Club, some lay flat hit by pellets while passed on wet handkerchiefs to their col-

The police action followed a series of baton charges against reporters and press photographers on the Topkhana Road.

Yet earlier, police broke up a meeting of the hartal organisers at about 5-45pm near the Baitul Mukarram Mosque. Organisers alleged that police brushed aside their repeated requests to remove a large number of Jamaat activists who had gathered in the alley beside the House Building Finance Corporation, some 50 yards from the venue of the meeting.

"First they tried to silence the voice of the press, and now they are trying to shoot journalists inside the Jatiya Press Club," said Abdur Razzak MP in an emotion-choked voice. Razzak arrived at the scene immediately after the rampage.

Even during the impromptu meeting of the DUJ, teargas cannisters hissed over the gathering while policemen chased the people outside on the road with batons.

A procession of the journal ists to protest the assault again came under attack by police from behind, witnesses said. Angry journalists exchanged words with the police officials


