No newspapers were published Tuesday.


The strike was jointly called by the Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ) and the Dhaka Union of Journalists (DUJ).

ISLAMABAD, June 23: Former Afghan President Babrak Karmal and key militia commander General Rasheed Dostum were killed in an air crash near the capital Kabul on Sunday, Pakistan's official APP news agency reported Mon-"day, says Reuter.

APP quoted a Pakistani Member of Parliament, Samiul Haq, as saying that the information about the crash was given to him by Afghanistan's interim Justice Minister Jalaluddin Haqqani while both were in the Saudi city of Jeddah.


