On trial, the accused was found guilty of murder and sentenced to suffer lifeterm. The case was conducted by Public Prosecutor Rahamat ullah Azad.



Youngman commits suicide

A youngman committed suicide by taking insecticide at village Girdd under Golapganj upazila of the district recently.

On getting information, a police party sent the body the victim Abdul Ahad Chowdhury (34) to the Sylhet MAG Osmany Medical College Hospital for post-mortem. The cause of the incident could not be ascertained immediately. A case of unnatural death had been registered with the police in this connection.

Miscreants kill one

One person was killed by miscreants at village Kargram under Beanibazar upazila of Sylhet district recently.

According to the reports, at about 11 pm on the night of incident some armed people called one Cherag Ali (40) out of his house and tied up the hands and legs of the victim and hit him with sharp weapons. As a result, he died on the spot.

His body was recovered from a ditch near Dighirpar area: The police sent the body to the Sylhet MAG Osmany Medical College Hospital for post-mortem. Police later on handed over the body to the relatives of the deceased. A case in this connection

had already been registered with the police.

Abdus Sattar, Additional District and Sessions Judge and Special Tribunal Judge, Sunanganj sentenced one person to suffer rigorous imprisonment for seven years for holding wine in his house and fined Taka three thousand in default to suffer imprisonment for six months more. The prosecution case in

brief is that, on getting secret informations, on 22 August, 1991, a police party from the Sunamganj PS went to the residence of one Narain Das of Madhyabazar area of Sunamganj town and recovered 48 bottles of wine from there. Fol lowing registration of a case the police submitted chargesheet against the said person after investigations.

The court after examining all the records and witnesses found the accused person guilty and passed the said sentence.

One killed by nephew

One person was killed by his nephew at village Khoshirgram under Kurarbazar union of Beantbazar upazila of the district recently.

According to the reports, at about 1-30 pm, on the day of incident, a clash ensued between the nephew Shamsul liaque and the uncle Belal Ahmed as sequel to a previous feud. At one stage, the nephew became furious and took a dagger from a nearby place and hit Belal sharply. The victim was immediately rushed to the hospital, where the doctors declared him dead.

The killer nephew Shamsul Haque had fled away since after the incident occurred, it is reported.

A case in this connection had already been registered with the Beanibazar police station. The post-mortem on the body was performed in the Sylhet MAG Osmany Medical College Hospital. The body was later handed over to his rela-

Stealing of nut-bolts rampant

Stealing of nut-bolts from the railway lines, led to the stoppage of train communication in the Sylhet-Akhaura Section for three hours, on the night following June 17 last. According to the reports,

on the night following Wednesday last at about 10 pm, one Shashi Kumar took away 10 nuts and bolts from the railway line near the Moglabazar Station. The local people caught him redhanded and handed over him to the GRP at Moglabazar Rail Station.

Law, order situation deteriorates

RAJSHAHI, June 23 : Law and order situation in the city has scriously deteriorated in recent days causing great concern among the dwellers, reports UNB.

Inter-mahalla clashes are now the daily feature in the city. One person died and over 300 others were injured during last one month in about 35 such clashes.

Forty cases of smuggling, more than 100 other crimes like forging of currency notes, theft of motor cycles, abduction etc occurred here during the period.

Anti-social activities such as drinking of liquor, toll collection, teasing of girls are going on unabated in almost every parts of the city. The Silk Factory, Upashahar, Tikkapara, Talaimari areas, Ganakpara crossing. Court area and some other places of the city have become the main centres of anti-social activities.

At least two incidents of inter-mahalla clash occurred during the last one week. One

Rabi (24) was killed and 11 others were injured on June 17 in a clash between the dwellers of Baliapukur and Mirerchak mahallas over teasing a girl.

Another clash between two groups of youths of Panchabati and Raninagar following a dispute of sharing toll money has been continuing for more than one month. A total of 15 shops and houses were set on fire and valuables were looted in those areas and some 32 people were so far injured during

At least 12 motor cycles have been stolen in the last two months from different points of the city. A well organised gang are engaged in stealing the motor cycles. Police could neither recover a single motor cycle nor arrest a miscreant in this connection.

City dwellers alleged that the mastans and criminals are moving freely with the law enforcement agencies remained apathetic. However, police said due to shortage of manpower

JHENIDAH, June 23: Aus and broadcast aman paddy cultivation have been facing setback in six upazilas of the district during this season due to persisting drought, reports

drought, so far 23,135 and 7,270 acres of land have been brought under aus and aman cultivation respectively which is far short of the target. Mentionable that 84,720

and 24,915 acres of land were brought under aus and broadcast aman paddy cultivation respectively in the district last According to farmers Ben-
