Jute spinners criticise budget

Bangladesh Jute Spinners Association at a meeting Sunday urged the government to withdraw certain measures proposed in the national budget for 1992-93 which it said would affect the jute industry.

The meeting said the enhancement of interest on loans taken as working capital for the jute industries, price hike of spare parts and imposition of one per cent tax on export value would adversely affect the jute sector.

Criticizing the imposition of one per cent tax on the export value the meeting observed that the tax should rather be exempted completely. Meanwhile Bangladesh Agricultural Machinery Merchant Association at an emergency meeting on the proposed budget criticized the imposition of duty on import of various agricultural accessories.

The meeting said that the imposition of duties on diesel engines used in agriculture and 15 per cent tax on pedal tractor would affect the agriculture.

The meeting presided over by Abdur Rauf was addressed among others by Giasuddin Chowdhury Khokon, Shamsul Huq Shikdar, Fazal Amin, MA Quasem, Ruhul Amin Bachchu, MA Zaili and Jahiruddin Shahjahan.

'Modhusudan enriched Bangla poetry'

Poet Michael Modhusudan Dutta was fondly remembered at a discussion meeting for his embellishment of the Bangla poetry through introduction of innovative ideas like blank verse, reports BSS.

Abdul Mannan Syed read out the main article on the poet - more known as 'Modhukabi' at the discussion meeting at the Bangla Academy marking his 119th death anniversary.

Professor Aminul Islam of Right State University, United States, presided over while Bashir-al-Helal of Bangla Academy gave the welcome speech.

Speakers, who included Prof. Khandker Ashraf Hossain and Prof. Naren Biswas, said the introduction of the blank verse (Amritrakhar Chhanda) in the Bangla poem marked a momentous development for the language.

They opined that works of the poet still dazzled the readers - more than one hundred and thirty years after he brought about the remarkable addition to the style in the poetry.

Econo ball pen case dismissed

Bangladesh press council has dismissed the defamation case filed on behalf of Econo ball pen manufacturer G.G. Ball Pen Industries Ltd. against Dainik Purbanchal, Khulna, according to a press council press release Monday, reports BSS.

The complainant accused that the said newspaper published a news item on January 8, 1992 titled 'Econo ball pen chhatratir pran ker nilo' violating ethics of journalism and affected the goodwill of the company.

The judgement committee observed that the newspaper did not violate ethics of journalism by mentioning the name of 'Econo ball pen' in publishing the death news of a minor student.

According to the published news Iqamul, a student of class two of Barandi Para Hafjia Madrasa in Jessore town, was killed when his class mate Shaheen attacked him in the throat with Econo ball pen while they were playing during break of class.

The judgement advised that one should avoid mentioning the trade name of an arm or an object used while reporting a death story if it was not especially required.

The judgement committee consisted of chairman of the press council Justice Ruhul Islam, and members Barrister Shaukat Ali Khan and Sanaullah Noori.

Books presented to Insurance Academy

RCC announces budget of Taka 78.5 cr for 92-93

RAJSHAHI, June 29: Mayor of Rajshahi City Corporation (RCC) Mizanur Rahman Minu (today) announced the proposed Taka 78 crore 50 lakh annual budget of the city corporation for 1992-93 fiscal at a press conference at his office room yesterday, reports BSS.

Of the total earnings, a sum of Taka 7 crore 86 lakh will come from corporation's own source, while Taka 15 crore 25 lakh from government's development fund as grant and Taka 55 crore 27 lakh from special grant.

Of the total expenditure, Taka 35 crore will be spent for construction of a water treatment plant and supplying network, Taka 9 crore for construction of sewerage, Taka 15 crore for construction of city building complex.

A sum of Taka 10 lakh has been earmarked for afforestation and development of environment and Taka 6 lakh for education and cultural sector.

An amount of Taka one crore 40 lakh will be spent from revenue earnings for development and renovation of city roads and Taka two crore 22

lakh will be spent for staff salary.

Besides, the development projects include Minar and Central Shishu Park, installation of traffic signal and sodium light, construction and development of markets, development of 30 kilometre sewerage, slum area development, development of Central Eidgah, construction of two Eidgahs, renovation of Sonadigha, electrification, purchase of vehicles and construction of a housing estate.

Mizanur Rahman Minu said Rajshahi City Corporation would be divided into three zones - north, east and south - to ensure civic amenities to the city dwellers.

The mayor said outstanding dues of the city corporation stood at Taka five crore. No additional tax has been imposed on city dwellers, he added.

The mayor said development work worth Taka eight crore was being implemented in the city in 1991-92 year. He hoped that the proposed development-oriented budget would ensure maximum civic facilities.

Major rivers continue to swell

Country's major rivers continued swelling with the Surma surging above danger level inundating its vicinities, reports UNB.

Officials, however, said Monday flood situation would improve gradually in Sylhet region while forecast steady rise of water level in the Ganges and the Brahmaputra.

All other rivers in the Meghna basin, including Kushiara, Manu and Khowai, were flowing below the danger level, excepting the Surma flowing 8 centimeter above danger mark at Sunamganj.

KCC budget announced

The BCCMA, which held a meeting to review the proposed revenue budget for 1992-93, demanded withdrawal of new fiscal proposals like deduction of one per cent income tax in advance at source on export value, mandatory pre-shipment inspection for import of raw materials for export-oriented industries and reduction of income tax rebate to 50 per cent on export earnings.

SKOP holds rallies

Sramik Karmachari Oikya Parishad (SKOP) Monday held rallies and gate meetings in the industrial areas of Chittagong, Khulna and Rajshahi to drum up support for its 48-hour strike, reports UNB.

SKOP has called for the strike on July 7-8 demanding implementation of its 5-point demand.

The demands include end to retrenchment of workers, implementation of minimum national wage and Wage Commission award, halting denationalisation, opening of closed mills and annulment of all black laws.

The labour leaders who addressed the rallies included Abdu Salam Khan, Iskander Ali, Mokhesur Rahman, Motaharuddin, Mujibur Rahman and Shah Atiul Islam, said a press release.

Entry fee of Museum Tk 2

Parliamentary Standing Committee on Cultural Affairs has decided to introduce an entrance fee of Tk two in Bangladesh National Museum, reports UNB.

State Minister for Cultural Affairs Prof. Jahanara Begum will formally inaugurate this system by buying a ticket at 10.15 Wednesday, said a press release.

Bank holiday tomorrow

The Bangladesh Bank and all scheduled banks will remain closed for transaction on July 1 (Wednesday), the bank holiday, marking the new financial year, said a BB press release Monday, reports UNB.

Obituary

Hasina Akhtar, wife of Rezaul Karim, Deputy Director (Eng), Bangladesh Bank died at a local clinic after prolonged illness on Saturday. She was 39, says a press release.

Her Namaz-e-Janaza was held Sunday morning and later buried at Shahjahanpur graveyard. She left behind her husband, only son, mother, four brothers, four sisters and a host of relations to mourn her death. Her eldest brother is Shah Abdul Hannan, Deputy Governor, Bangladesh Bank.

Tree Plantation Week begins tomorrow

Need for taking massive afforestation programme by NGOs underscored

A tree plantation week will be observed from tomorrow (Wednesday) as part of the government efforts to turn afforestation drive into a mass movement for maintaining ecological balance and environmental upgradation throughout the country, reports BSS.

In the backdrop of the recent Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro of Brazil, this year's tree plantation week in Bangladesh assumed a special significance. Foreign Minister Mustafizur Rahman led a high level delegation from Bangladesh to the summit and made valuable contribution to its proceedings.

The government has geared up its activities to involve people in a mass scale in the tree-plantation drive in line with the summit declarations. The Prime Minister has already directed her cabinet colleagues to take up elaborate programmes and involve the people of all categories of the society in the campaign for planting and preserving trees.

In a letter to the cabinet members the Prime Minister instructed them to take up broad-based afforestation programmes in their own districts and districts under their charges during the tree-plantation week as well as the entire tree-plantation season.

The Prime Minister said hursing of the planted saplings was essential for successful implementation of tree plantation. She underscored the need for taking up massive afforestation programme by the Non-Government Organisations (NGOs) on voluntary basis besides the government efforts. Begum Zia said the programme could not be successful

without the participation of all levels of people of the society.

Begum Zia also directed the ministers to give necessary instructions and supervisory responsibilities to all concerned under their respective organisations, offices and establishments to take up massive plantation programme and make sure that each of the tree planted survives.

Describing the significance of afforestation the Prime Minister said there was a need for one fourth forest coverage of the total land of the country for maintaining healthy environment. But Begum Zia said the size of the forestry was much less than the desired one. A large part of the forestry has already been eliminated due to the increasing pressure of population that created new demand for habitation, cultivable land and firewood. The existing size of the forest in the country was insufficient for planting and preserving trees.
