Govt gives top priority to rural uplift: Talukdar

LGRD Minister Barrister day said the present government has taken some bold measures for restructuring the local government system to meet the hopes and aspirations of the people, reports

He said this while opening the ninth meeting of the technical committee of the Centre on Integrated Rural Development for Asia and the Pacific (CIRDAP) at a local hotel.

The minister said as Bangladesh is primarily a rural country, the government has accorded top priority to rural development in a bid to alleviate rural poverty, promote the wellbeing of the masses and to improve their living standards.

He said over 80% of the people live in the rural areas and more than half of them are landless and another 25% find it difficult to ensure subsistence from their meagre cultivable land. The rest of the people live unemployed and according to the fourth fiveyear plan about 51% of the rural people are living below the poverty line. So they cannot meet the basic needs of life.


