Youths to be motivated to establish drug-free society

Speakers at an international anti-drug seminar in Dhaka Thursday called for creating mass awareness specially through motivating the youths to establish a drug-free society, reports UNB.
The seminar was organised by anti-drug youth organisation Green Leaf Campaign in collaboration with the USIS-American Centre, Dhaka on the occasion of International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking.
Addressing the seminar at the USIS-American Centre, eminent psychiatrist Prof Nazimuddin Chowdhury suggested that awareness be created in all spheres of life and preventive measures taken to help solve the ever increasing drug menace.
"Preventive method is one of the best ways to check drug addiction", he said.
Terming students and youths as the worst victims of drug abuse, he said the rate of drug addiction is higher among the students living in hostels or dormitories than those living with their parents.
Non-residential students are less prone to drug abuse as they are under the strict control of their parents who can easily keep track of their wards, he observed.
He pointed out that the children whose parents are addicted to drugs can easily fall victims to drug abuse of different types.
"Political activists are also very much prone to drug addiction", he said.
Establishment Secretary Hasinur Rahman said anti-drug awareness as well as rehabilitation of the drug addicts are very important for controlling drug abuse effectively.
The seminar was addressed, among others, by Counsellor of Public Affairs of US Embassy Ray Peppers, Director of Institute of Mental Health, Dhaka Medical College Dr Hedayetul Islam, News Editor of Daily Telegraph Rahman Zahangir and Chairman of Green Leaf Campaign Talukdar Pavel.

Social awareness a must to help handicapped: Biswas

President Abdur Rahman Biswas underscored the need for creating a social awareness to the welfare of the children, particularly the treatment and rehabilitation of the handicapped and help grow them as worthy citizens, reports BSS.
He was talking to a 15-member delegation of the Bangladesh Shishu Kalyan Parishad, led by its president Nazir Hussain, when they called on him at Bangabhaban yesterday.
The President expressed satisfaction at the efforts of the parishad for the welfare of children and urged them to continue it with dedication and devotion.
He advised them to expand the medicare facilities at the "Firoza Bari Pangu Shishu Hospital" in the city so that more handicapped children could be treated and rehabilitated with due care.
He also stressed the need to reduce the child mortality rate in the country and sought more cooperation of well-to-do section of the society in proper upbringing of the disabled.
Among others, Prof Bashira Mannan, Kazi Anwarul Kabir, Azizul Islam and Raushan Ara Begum were present.
Meanwhile President Abdur Rahman Biswas called upon the conscious people to save the natural beauty of "Sundarban", the largest forest of the country by preventing its destruction.
He said that massive afforestation programme was the means to avoid the ecological imbalance and to save the nature from the dearth of trees.
President was exchanging views with a 9-member delegation of the Khulna divisional association based in the capital, when they called on him at Bangabhaban.
President Biswas said that the whole universe was being affected by natural hazards and that had to be stopped through concerted efforts of all.
Led by Prof K Ali, general secretary of the association, the delegation apprised the President of various problems of the Khulna division.
They also informed the President about the unemployment problem of the youths, and urged him to see that new industrial plants were set up and the closed ones reopened in the region.
Among others, Prof Dr Yousof Ali, Dr Hafizur Rahman, Abu Bakar Sheikh, Alhaj Abdul Majed and Kazi Abdul Majed of the association were present.
