"I'm not abetting man. If I was, I would bet that 'He'll be back," Johnson said in an interview conducted for ESPN television. Excerpts were published Saturday in New York Newsday and will be shown on ESPN on Sunday.

Johnson said he would have returned to the Lakers last season if he thought the team had a chance to win the championship.

Johnson retired from the Los Angeles Lakers on Nov 7 when he learned he had contracted the HIV-virus, which causes AIDS. But he played in the NBA All-Star Game and was voted Most Valuable Player, and is currently starting for the US Olympic basketball

Johnson said he has not reached a final decision on returning in the fall. He said he will only return if he's healthy and if his wife Cookie, ap-

Laker officials have indicated they will support whatever decision Johnson makes.






