

### Jakarta Bike team due in city tomorrow

A five-member Indonesian Green Bike team, now on a global mission to save environment, arrives here tomorrow, reports UNB. The team, which started bicycling from Jakarta on June

18, will tour Dhaka-Mymensingh on July 12. Mymensingh-Jamalpur-Bogra on July 13. Bogra-Rajshahi on July 14 and Rajshahi-Barhampore (India) on July 15. A press release said yesterday Indonesian Forum for Environment Walhi, an NGO, had arranged "The Green Bike Tour for World Peace and Friendship". It will cover 21 countries and round off the 200-day journey at Hiroshima on January 18.

The team will use four bicycles of Indonesian origin and another gold-plated cycle called Green Bike. After the end of the venture, the Green Bike will be donated to the United Nations Environment Programme in Hiroshima, a Japanese city strafeled with atom bombs during World War II.

The countries to be covered are Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, India, Pakistan, Turkey, Greece, Yugoslavia, Hungary, Austria, Switzerland, France, Belgium, the Netherlands, Germany, Denmark, Sweden, England, the USA and Japan besides Bangladesh.

The tour aims to make world friendship and enhance world consciousness, welfare and peace irrespective of caste and creed. It is also meant to promote natural resources conservation and save the world from pollution which is caused by oil-burn and to encourage the people to use non-motor transportation.

### Outgoing Swedish envoy meets Biswas Dhaka assured of more aid

The Swedish government will provide increased quantum of aid for various development programmes of Bangladesh, reports UNB. This was communicated to President Abdur Rahman Biswas by the outgoing Swedish Ambassador to Bangladesh, Carl Olof Cederlad, who made a

farewell call on the former at Bangabhaban yesterday. The Ambassador appreciated the economic policy, including market economy, introduced by the present democratic government and hoped that this policy would get support from the industrialised nations.

The Swedish envoy said his country happy to see the introduction of democratic system in Bangladesh and the mutual tolerance and understanding between the government and opposition in parliament.

Ambassador Cederlad mentioned the donation of two million dollars of Sweden in aid of Rohingya refugees of Myanmar and hoped that the refugee problem would be solved at the earliest. President Biswas hoped that relations between Bangladesh and Sweden would be further expanded, particularly

in the economic and political fronts in the years ahead. He sought more economic cooperation from Sweden for rebuilding the country's infrastructure and bringing stability in market economy introduced in Bangladesh for its sound growth.

Banks directed to take part in tree-planting campaign

Bangladesh Bank has directed all banks to take part in the country-wide Tree Plantation Campaign, reports UNB. It has requested the chief executives of the banks to circulate necessary orders for nursing and planting trees to their different branches across the country.

### UN urged to launch military operation against Bosnia-Herzegovina

The Society for Rule of Law Wednesday urged the United Nations to launch immediately a military operation against Serbia to stop its attack on Bosnia-Herzegovina, reports UNB.

Serbian aggression defying UN sanction has left thousands of people displaced in the newly independent Muslim-majority republic in the Balkan peninsula.

In a statement, Secretary General of the Society Abdus Sobhan expressed serious concern over the constant violation of human rights by Serbia by its artillery attacks and bombardment on the republic. Sobhan suggested a Kuwait-style putsch against Serbia to protect the independence and existence of Bosnia-Herzegovina.

The proposals suggested that the problems of weaving industry could be solved through formulation of weaving commission, withdrawal of cases against the defaulter weavers and providing subsidy.
