Dr Nazrul Islam of Dhaka University presided over the seminar jointly organised by Dhaka City Museum and Bangladesh Shapoti Institute.

Architects Abdul Mohatmen and Selina Afroza presented the key note papers.

Referring to the measures to solve various problems of the city, Abbas said a Japanese agency was working on a Tk 900 crore project to remove the water logging.

Referring to the proposed shifting of the central jail to Gazipur, he said no multi-storied building or commercial complex will be allowed in the 37 acres of land of the jail after the shifting.

Jana Parishad

The convention of the Dhaka city unit of Bangladesh Jana Parishad will be held on the third week of September, says a press release. This was decided at a meeting of its thana representatives at the central office on Friday. Schedules to form thana committees were also announced at the meeting presided over by the convenor of the city unit KM Mohiuddin Chowdhury.

Garments Workers Fed

The National Garments Workers Federation held a rally Friday in favour of implementing the four point agreement reached between SKOP and the government recently, says a press release. Starting at the Topkhana Road the rally went around different parts of the city. Later at a meeting the General Secretary of the federation Amirul Huq Amin demanded that the garment factory owners implement the four points immediately.

Sramik Front

The President of Shamajtantrik Sramik Front Abdullah Sarkar and General Secretary Abdul Razaque in a statement Friday slated the comments of Bangladesh Employers' Association on the recent agreement signed between the government and the Sramik Karmachari Oikya Parishad (SKOP), in the statement, the front leaders said that the agreement in no way was a barrier towards the setting up of industries. They added that SKOP is made up of 19 recognised trade union federations of the country.

Juba Union

Bangladesh Juba Union President Mahub Zaman and General Secretary Muhammad Hilal Uddin Friday in a joint statement said another dark chapter of the infamous Scimitar scandal had been exposed by the arrest of its official Muslim Lakhani for forgery.

They demanded arrest and punishment of the persons involved in the Scimitar scandal.

They also urged the government to take immediate initiatives to extract gas and oil from Haripur and Kailastila.

Gana Azadi League

Bangladesh Gana Azadi League President Al-Hajj Abdus Samad Advocate and Joint General Secretary Kazi Alilul Islam Ukil in a statement Friday welcoming the agreement signed between the government and Sramik Karmachari Oikya Parishad (SKOP) said the 5 point demand of SKOP had become a national demand.

The leaders said labour unrest was increasing in the country because of the government's policy to retrench workers and to denationalise factories in favour of the upper class.

In another statement the leaders criticized raising of the private university bill in the parliament. They said it would make education expensive.

Nurul Islam Nahid, General Secretary of Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB) in a statement said that false cases were lodged against 15 pro-liberation politicians, by Jamaat in Jalpurhat.

He said, under the influence of a certain quarter freedom fighter commander Amjad Hossain, freedom fighter Abul Hossain and Awami League leader Mollah Samsul were framed in another chargesheet.

The leader demanded withdrawal of cases against freedom fighter commander Habibur Rahman, CPB leader Dewan Baduzzaman, Ganatantrik Party leader Nandulal Parshi, freedom fighter Md Janab Ali, journalist Mostakin Faruk and Abdur Rahman Rony and eminent businessman Aziz Mollah immediately.

Krishak Samity demands new agri policy

Deelard, also Convenor of Bangladesh Human Rights Commission, hoped that the committee will recommend measures within the Constitution.
