## China plans change in job system

BEIJING, July 14: China plans to scrap its system of jobs guaranteed for life regardless of rising unemployment, an official news paper reported Tuesday, according to

"The reform policy is irrevocable," the China Daily quoted Labour Minister Ruan Chongwu as saying in a circular distributed to government departments. He urged them to do everything possible to create new jobs, including encouraging private enterprise.

The paper quoted him as saying the number of urban jobless has climbed nearly half a million this year, to about four million people or 2.8 per cent of the urban workforce.

He was the second government official to make such a pledge in less than a week. Wang Shiyuan, General Secretary of the State Commission to Restructure the Economy said Friday that economic reforms were not being slowed because of worker opposition.

Fears of unrest among the urban workforce halted plans in the 1980s to smash the 'iron rice bowl," the Chinese nickname for a system in USAID.

#### **USAID** grants Moroco \$6m for privatisation

WASHINGTON, July 14: The US Agency for International Development has granted Morocco \$ six million for a privatisation programme, USAID announced July 13. The grant will help sinance the privatisation of 112 enterprises, including banks, hotels and industries that are controlled or partially held by the government, according to

said in early June that 1.4 million workers had been laid off so far in 1992.

The figure of those officially considered jobless is not very meaningful, however, because it does not include several million youth who are waiting for their first job assignment sometimes for years — or rural workers who have nothing to do most of the year.

Also not included are 10 million to 20 million people who, by government estimate, are on the payrolls of state companies but actually have nothing to do.

These are the people the government wants companies to dismiss or give real jobs. Ruan said the government plans to keep unemployment to 3.5 per cent or less. putting pressure on local authorities to create jobs.

His circular suggested that they encourage development of private companies and the retail and service sectors, which were given little attention in the past because of the gov ernment's preoccupation with building heavy industry

### BCCI creditors appeal against court ruling

LONDON, July 14: Creditors of the closed Bank of Credit and Commerce International (BCCI) began an appeal on Monday against a court ruling which approved a controversial worldwide compensation plan, reports Reuter.

The court allowed a group of creditors to take over an appeal which had been lodged by the British creditors committee but which was with drawn later.

The creditors lawyer argued that the senior judge who approved the plan should not have substituted his commercial judgement over that of the creditors and that the wishes of a majority of the creditors should be paramount.

The creditors committee and others who lost money when regulators shut BCCI, once one of the world's largest private banking groups, last July opposed the compensation plan at a hearing last month, saying it was too little.

But the judge, Sir Donald Nicholls, said the terms, although not very much, were preferable to long, costly and uncertain legal action against BCCI's majority shareholders in Abu Dhabi

Abu Dhabi has offered an initial cash contribution of 1.7 billion dollar towards a total 30 to 40 per cent return to depositors. The rest would come from liquidation proceeds.

#### 8,125 kg silver seized from vessel in Gujarat NEW DELHI, July 14

Customs officers seized 8,125 kilograms of silver worth more than two million US dollar from a foreign vessel off the western state of Gujarat on Sunday, English daily The Stateman reported Tuesday, says Xinhua.

The entire crew of the ship comprising nine Koreans, five Myanmars, five Chinese and two Indonesians, were detained

The 246 silver slabs were kept ready by the alleged smugglers in three slings for delivery to a local craft.

The ship was coming from Malaysia via Singapore, where the sliver was loaded, it was reported.

### High interest rate slows economic recovery: EC

BRUSSELS (Belgium), July 14: European Community fi nance ministers expressed concern Monday that high interest rates were hurting economic recovery in Europe, reports AP.

Everybody thinks that interest rates in Europe are too high," said French Economics Minister Michel Sapin at a meeting of finance chicfs of the 12-nation trading block.

Norman Lamont Britian's chancellor of the exchequer. expressed hope that Germany's Bundesbank, its central bank, would not boost interest rates at a meeting later in the week.

Higher interest rates in conference. Germany, the EC's powerhouse economy, would likely force other community nations to boost rates as well, which could hurt economic growth.
