RAJSHAHI, July 15 Mayor of Rajshahi City Corporation (RCC) Mizanur Rahman Minu Tuesday formally inaugurated the tree plantation programme of the City Corporation by planting a sapling at the premises of Rajshahi City College with a call to the city dwellers to plant saplings at their house premises and nourish it for maintaining ecological balance, reports


