Biman making profits in international routes

Biman-Bangladesh Airlines is now making profits in the international routes and it will be further boosted with opening of the new destination in Japan, Managing Director of Biman Abdul Mueyed Chowdhury said yesterday, according to a message received in Dhaka.

Talking to BSS on board, Biman's Tokyo-Singapore-Dhaka flight, Mueyed Chowdhury said the Dhaka-Nagoya route via Singapore and Bangkok and Dhaka-Tokyo route would boost Biman's profit earnings in the international routes besides strengthening further the existing excellent economic, trade and diplomatic relations between Japan and Bangladesh.

Chowdhury on his way back home from Tokyo yesterday after the inauguration of the Biman's Dhaka-Nagoya flight on July 14, said Bangladesh was trying to attract foreign investments and tourists from Japan in a big way.

Talking to this correspondent, the Managing Director said Biman should try to explore more destinations in Japan other than the Tokyo and Nagoya to accelerate the revenue earnings of the national flag carrier.

When asked whether the new Dhaka-Nagoya route would be a profitable one, Chowdhury said certainly this route would be a very profitable venture.

He said Biman needed more aircrafts as it was now operating in the international route with only four aircrafts. We are trying to improve further the services of Biman and to change the manual system of check-in by introducing the computerized departure control system.

He said Biman was now working to inaugurate the Dhaka-New York route, the 24th destination of the national flag carrier.

The Tokyo-Dhaka flight yesterday had 242 passengers out of which 60 were home-bound guests of Biman's Dhaka-Nagoya inaugural flight.

Work on sewerage line in Mirpur area begins

Implementation work on the sewerage line installation programme in Mirpur area of the city has begun and it is expected to be completed by 1994, reports BSS.

This was stated by LORD and Cooperatives Minister Abdus Salam Talukdar while replying to a question from Begum Bani Ashraf of BNP in the Jatiya Sangsad yesterday.
