A large number of farmers have been passing their days in hardship. Often they sell their utensils and domestic animals to pay off the debt.

These unscrupulous money lenders have rendered hundreds of peasants and small traders landless.

Aus paddy on 20,000 acres under pest attack

RAJBARI, July 29: Aus paddy on 20,000 areas of land under pest attack in Faridpur, Rajbari and Gopalganj districts. The farmers of the areas informed that the pests are locally known as pamri and

mazra pokas.

The cultivation of aus paddy is late this year due to continuous drought. The pest attack at the middle point has been destroying the paddy very much.

According to Agriculture Extension Department, pests have already attacked at least 1,000 acres of paddy in these districts and it is increasing day by day.

The district-wise break up of the pest attack is: Rajbari-940 acres, Faridpur-14,150 acres, and the rest are in Gopalganj.

The target of aus cultivation in Rajbari was 1.15 lakh acres, 1.20 lakh acres in Faridpur.

According to Agriculture Extension Department source, out of the three districts, pest attack in Faridpur is lesser.

It is informed that in many cases the insecticides are working properly for which the attack is spreading vary

The farmers have urged the concerned authorities to take the necessary steps to combat the pest attack to save the crops.

Bauls, followers of Lalon in deplorable condition

Bauls, who lead ascetic life and claim to be the followers of Sufi saint Lalon Shah, are in a deplorable condition in Chuadanga district following a hitch with some local people in village Shialmari of Alamdanga.

However, DC of Chudanga told UNB Correspondent at Jhenidah that the situation at Shialmari is normal at the moment and assured his whole hearted cooperation for the security of every member of the community. The issue of the repression

on bauls was raised by SP of the district at a District Law and Order Committee Meeting last week, he added.

Bauls also live in Rajshahi, Jhenidah and Kushtia district and adjacent areas, around the shrine of Lalon Shah where thousands of spectators, followers and researchers throughout the world gathered annually.

In Chuadanga, at least 50-60 baul families reside in four villages of Alamdanga thana These are Shialmari, Kotiapara, Majhab and Krisnapur.

Situation in Shialmari recently turned worse where some local people has a braw with the bauls last March which led to the eviction of the baul family in the last week of April, allegedly by the instigation of some influential people of the area.

Informed sources said some local people backed by the former UP member Ohid Hossain compelled the bauls to leave the village in the face of social boycott.

Local people said bauls of Shialmari did not vote for Ohid Hossain in the last UP elec-

tion, which might be the reason behind Ohid's annoyance.

When contacted present UP Chairman Abul Kalam told UNB correspondent at Jhenidah, most of the bauls and their families have returned to Shialmari but two bauls — Riazuddin and Khaleque are vet to return.

They are not coming to their residence as former UP member and Chairman candidate of last UP election Ohid reportedly threatened them, he added.

But UNB correspondent at Chaudanga said the number of bauls who have not yet returned to the village would be at least five including baul guru Fazlur Rahman.

Another source said

Riazuddin and Khaleque are unable to return back to village as supporters of Ohid have become annoyed after filing two cases against them. However, Chuadanga thana

court recently acquitted all of them as the petitioners failed to appear in the court on three to four successive dates.

He also alleged that the supporters of Ohid were checking them from going to the upazila court even after the filing of the two cases against them.

On the otherhand, the opposing group submitted another application to the DC and brought allegation against the bauls that they were indulged in anti-social activities and instigating local Muslim believers to follow the baul ideology.

Usually bauls remain detached from people who claim to be 'sariatee' and never interfere in their activities.

According to them, know thyself must be the motto of human life and it can be done by following the instructions of a Guru or a Sufi, who has become completely free from the materialistic life. Talking to UNB, the UNO of

Alamdanga admitted that bauls of the district were being attacked twice, when they had taken an initiative to hold a function near the central office of bauls, Sufi Baul and sadhu-Guru Seba Sangha, at Porapara in Damurhata thana of the dis-

He, however, said the situation, by this tie, has become normal in Shialmari village and most of the bauls who left their residences, are now leading normal life compromising with the their non-baul Muslim neighbours.

It may be mentioned that President of the Lalon Parishad and Assistant Director (Research) of Bangla Academy Dr Riazul Huq in a letter on May 13, suggested the bauls of Shialmari to adjust themselves with the non-baul neighbours.

Dr Riazul Hug, who recently got Ph D on the life and works of Lalon Shah, claim that Lalon Shah was not a 'baul' and the philosophy of the bauls is not at all lined with the teachings of Lalon.

A Lalon expert Golam Mostafa, however, told UNB. 'baul' is an Arabic word, which means who conceive their life and living beyond all 'dharmas' or phenomenon world. He added that in that sense Lalon was a typical baul.

However, all those followers of Lalon can not be called baul, Golam Mostafa said.

Smuggling rampant in Jessore

JESSORE, July 29: Smuggling is going on large-scale along the border of the district for a long time causing mounting losses to the national

economy. According to sources, transaction of contraband goods are being carried out freely and openly through new

technique. Smugglers are crowding ghats (border point) day and night from different places with cycles, motor cycles, scooters, vans and microbuses

for transportation of the goods. Ghat maliks (care takers) are appointed there with the duty of giving line, handle affairs, collect their share and keep complete account to daily

transactions. They work like

C&F agents. Kulia, Daulatpur, Arsinghra, Pukuria, Goira, Gadadharpur, Moshampur, Shahzadpur and Kabilpur under Chowgacha and Kashipur, Salkona, Laxmipur, Nizampur, Bahadurpur, Daulatpur, Goga and Benapole under Sharash thana in the district are the main points of smug-

According to another report, cards are being issued by all thanas of the districts to smugglers both professional

and probational for safety in

their illegal business. A new unofficial post, 'cashier' has been created in each thana. He is incharge of the thana for collection of monthly or weekly payments. He goes on field visit regularly

and settles problems if any. Besides, in plain cloths, the thana police move around the areas from time to time to check the validity of the cards issued by them for carrying the illegal trade through payments. They issue of card is an open

secret The incoming smuggled goods from Indian include sugar, paddy, rice, salt, cycle, spare parts, motor chesis medicines, sarees, matches, cattle, fruits and vegetables.

The outgoing smuggled goods are VCP, polyster clothes, hilsa fish, gold, silver, bronze, copper and bearings. There is no denying the fact that almost all the markets of

the district have been flooded with the smuggled Indian goods. It is complained that the role of the law enforcing agencies is responsible for the

large-scale smuggling along

the border and its sale to the

different markets of the district.

It is learnt that the smuggling will further increase if appropriate measures are not taken by the concerned authority.
