UN team gets no evidence of weapons

Saboteurs bombing UN agencies in Iraq

BAGHDAD, July 29: UN weapons inspectors wrapped up a search of Iraq's Agriculture Ministry today and said they had found no evidence directly relating to weapons of mass destruction, reports Reuter.

But team leader Achim Biermann of Germany, whose inspection ended a standoff laced with threats of US military action against Iraq, held out possibility that relevant materials could have been removed from the buildings.

AP adds: Baghdad boasted that Saddam Hussein's "dignity" had been restored by standing firm during a threeweek confrontation over the inspections programme.

Iraqi television showed a smiling Saddam taking a symbolic swim in the Tigris River near his hometown, and Iraqi news reports said Western leaders were losing sleep over pro-Saddam demonstrations in the country.

The UN experts apparently concluded what has been described as "systematic" search of the ministry.

There have been at least a dozen bombings since June 25, the official said. Two UN guards have been injured, and a Fijian UN guard was shot and killed in his sleep on July 16.

The UN official, who spoke on condition of anonymity, described the attacks as attempts to create insecurity and intimidate international aid workers helping Kurds in northern Iraq. He said his car was seriously damaged by a bomb placed underneath the vehicle.

The overall revenue collection including income tax for the year stood at Taka 7293 crore as against a target of Taka 7225 crore. The target for VAT, excise and supplementary duties was set at Taka 3049 crore.

The net revenue collection during 1990-91 was Taka 6152 crore.

The actual collection from manufactured items on which VAT was levied exceeded the target of Taka 353 crore by 32 per cent.

The National Board of Revenue collected Taka 465 crore as VAT on manufactured items and Taka 1400 crore in the form of excise duty on items outside VAT, which also exceeded the target of Taka 1360 crore by about three per

The total revenue collection in the form of excise duty during 1990-91 was Taka 1747 crore, out of which Taka 454 crore was collected from items which later came under

NBR collection in the form of VAT on imports was Taka 1284 crore. In contrast, sales tax on imports collected during 1990-91 stood at Taka 798 crore.

Collection from supplementary duty, in addition to VAT, levied on some manufactured and imported luxury items, during the period was about Taka 41 crore.

Supplementary duty on manufactured luxury items stood at Taka 26 crore outstripping the target of Taka 10 crore by nearly 164 per cent while that from imported items was Taka 15 crore, the target for which was set at Taka 10 crore.

During the last fiscal year a total of 4890 firms in the manufacturing and service sectors were registered and started paying VAT since the date it was imposed. Only about 1500 firms were registered before the imposition of

Another 8827 export and import firms were registered by the VAT authorities during the last fiscal year.

The VAT collection target for the ongoing fiscal year (1992-93) has been set at Taka 2850 crore, for excise duty Taka 500 crore and Taka 50 crore as supplementary duty. The enhanced VAT target

has been set in light of many new products being included in the VAT system from this

Shady land deal scandal

Cong-I men, BJP demand dismissal of Pawar

NEW DELHI, July 29: Indian Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao, who just got through a row with Hindus over a temple, now faces demands from his partymen and the Opposition for the dismissal of his Defence Minister, Sharad Pawar, reports AFP.

Thirty-six MPs from two parties, one rightwing and one centrist, demanded in a letter the dismissal of the 51-yearold Defence Minister earlier this week, on grounds that a Bombay High Court had found him guilty of shady land deals, reports said. We plan to take up the issue

in parliament, said today a spokesman from the Hindu- Revivalist Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) or Indian People's Party, adding that Pawar had "no right" to remain a minister in Rao's cabinet. The BJP with 119 MPs is

the largest opposition party in the federal parliament. It is backed by MPs from the centrist Janata Dal (People's Party) in its anti-Pawar campaign. The Bombay Court in a re-

cent 70 page judgement held Pawar guilty of allotting out-ofturn land to officials in the 1980s when he was Chief Minister of Maharashtra, which is administered from the state capital of Bombay.

The term out of turn refers to the act of illegally jumping the queue of people entitled to receive land.

"The High Court has passed severe strictures against Pawar, the then Chief Minister which no Court has ever done against any Chief Minister. In spite of this, Pawar is still a member of the Council of Ministers in the Central Government, said the joint opposition letter, which was released to

The letter said that if Hindu militants building a temple near an ancient Mosque in Northern India were forced to obey Court orders to stop their explosive drive Sunday then why should not Pawar be asked to step down.

We respected the judiciary and followed its orders. Now it is the turn of the government to showsome respect to the Courts, said the rightwing par-

Welcoming the Foreign Minister, Dumas said France would continue to provide as sistance to Bangladesh for its economic development and at the same time diversify the areas of cooperation between the two countries. Both the ministers re-

viewed the entire gamut of bilateral relations and agreed to adopt measures strengthen the existing ties for mutual benefit of the two peoples, officials said.

Dumas said the visit had provided an opportunity to establish high level political contact between the two countries after the democratic transition in Bangladesh.

Reiterating the importance that Bangladesh attached to its relations with France, Rahman recalled the role played by French President Francois Mitterrand in mobilising international support for the Flood Action Plan (FAP) for Bangladesh. He also briefed the French

Foreign Minister about the progress in the implementation of the plan in the light of decisions taken at the last review meeting. Mentioning the positive

role and contribution of France in the last aid consortium meeting in Paris, Rahman thanked the French government for providing debt relief upto 1988 and the decision to extend grants instead of grants and loans from 1991 onward.

Dumas accepted an invitation extended to him by the Foreign Minister to visit Bangladesh and indicated that the visit may take place at a date later this year.


