Coordination Committee Killing of Sen proves lawlessness

The National Coordination Committee for Realisation of the Spirit of Liberation War and Resisting the Killers and Collaborators of 71 yesterday demanded ban on the politics of Jamaat-Shibir, Juba Command and Freedom Party.

Leaders of the Coordination Committee in protest of the killing of CPB leader Ratan Sen also demanded arrest of the killers of Sen and resignation of the Home Minister.

Ratan Sen was killed Friday in Khulna in broad day light.

At a rally of the committee presided over by its Convener Mofazzal Hossain Maya, leaders

By Staff Correspondent said the murder of Sen was committed only 50 meters away from the Khulna SP office which proved that there were no rule of law in the country and alleged that the Home Minister had completely failed to ensure security to people.

The rally was addressed among others by Communist Party leader Nurul Islam Nahid, Aref Ahmed, Nani Gopaj Saha, Gazal Haq Shahjahan, Monirul Islam, Syed Hasan Imam and others.

Maya said Sen was the spokesman of the poor. He had been fighting for the rights of people from the British days.

Maya added, and he was outspoken about the atrocities of the politics of Jamaat Shibir.

Nahid said the Freedom Party, Juba Command and Jamaat-Shibir openly declared their intention to kill the personalities of the progressive forces and was killing the best personalities of the country ever had like Sen.

Aref said terrorism had spread all over the country. Presently, besides the killing of Sen in Khulna, Aref added, terrorists were ravaging JSD in Bogra and Rajshahi University.

Such activities could not continue without backing from the rulers, Aref said.

Monirul Islam warned the government saying that it was playing with fire by giving arms to the hands of Jamaat-Shibir.

The leaders also said that the progressive force wanted to believe that there were government and rule of law in the country but situation might lead them to take law in their own hands.

The rally held at Bangabandhu Avenue was followed by a protest procession.

Take steps to stop erosion, says JP MPs

By Staff Correspondent Jatiya Party MPs Saturday demanded of the government to take immediate steps to stop river bank erosion in the Gaibandha district.

Speaking at a joint press conference four JP MPs from Gaibandha said that more than one lakh people in 23 unions of the district had been severely affected by erosion by five rivers flowing through the district.

"A silent famine has gripped the area where erosion-hit people have been forced to sell off their tin roof for food," said Dr TIM Fazle Rabbi Chowdhury, MP (Gaibandha-3).

Lutfar Rahman Chowdhury (Gaibandha-4), Advocate Fazle Rabbi (Gaibandha-5) and Abdur Rashid Sarker (Gaibandha-2) were present at the press conference.

The MPs accused the government of politicising the development works in the rural areas and said that the works in the greater Rangpur had been suspended.

No test relief wheat had reached Gaibandha district as yet and the number of vulnerable Group Feeding (VGF) Card in the district had also been reduced, they alleged.

Construction work on Gaibandha-Sundarganj, Golapbagh-Birat, Gaibandha-Laxmipur, Gobindaganj-Gaibandha, Gaibandha-Saghata, Tengra-Badiakhali, Jumarbari-Sonatal roads had also been suspended, the JP MPs said and added that construction of the Balusi River Port was yet to start.

Tax structure will affect industries, BTMA alleges

By Staff Correspondent Bangladesh Textile Mills Association (BTMA) Saturday demanded withdrawal of 2.5 per cent excise duty on import of yarn. 7.5 per cent import duty on cotton and 15 per cent Value Added Tax (VAT) on the industry.

The association viewed that the present tax structure on the industry would make local textile products uncompetitive and the spinning mills would face closure.

The association said although the sector had been declared as a thrust sector, no initiatives had been taken to revamp the sector.

It also observed that unless the sector had been given incentives, foreign fabrics would replace local fabrics.
