2. Whereas you have furnished the image of Bangladesh and damaged future training programme in Japan by abandoning the place of work in Japan which is offensive under 3 (A) of Government Employees (Special Arrangement) Ordinance of 1979, and

3. Whereas you did not join duty in spite of advising your family by personal/family source letters to motivate you to immediately join to place of work in Japan as instructed vide Memo No. জন্ডউপকস/মিস্/১০ (Part-1)/৯১/৮৯ dt. 1-3-92, of Director General, Bureau of Manpower, Employment and Training, and

4. Whereas, because of your absence from place of work, show cause notice was issued to your permanent address vide জন্ডউপকস/মিস্/১০ (Part-1)/৯১/৮৯ dt. 21-3-92 and in spite of instructing you to show cause for your absence/fleeing from place of work in writing within 7 days, you did neither join your place of work nor make any contact with the head office of the Bureau, and

Whereas in respect of your fleeing from the place of work in Japan the training period was limited to six months and all trainees were sent back to the country and the last batch returned to Bangladesh on 22-05-92; those trainees were instructed to join their respective places of work within 05 (five) days of their return to the country; but on expiry of those 05 (five) days i.e. by 28-05-92 even you failed to join your place of work along with others or individually which is offensive under 3 (B) of Government Employees (Special Arrangement) Ordinance of 1979, and

Therefore, now, for your such offence you are accused for committing offence stated under Rule 3(A), 3(B) of Government Employees (Special Arrangement) Ordinance of 1979 and this notice is issued allowing you 05 (five) days time under Rule 5(1) of the said ordinance that why you shall not be "dismissed from service" as punishment stated under Rule 4(A) of the said ordinance and that whether you are interested to give a personal hearing. **Obituary reference in JS**

Parliament in an obituary reference Sunday condoned the death of Mohammad Abdul Wajed Chowdhury, an Awami League MP from Rajbari, reports BSS.

Chowdhury died of heart attack at PG Hospital on July 31 at the age of 66.

Deputy Speaker Humayun Khan Panni read out the condolence resolution as soon as the House reassembled in the afternoon after a two-day recess.

One minute silence was observed and special prayer offered to show respect to and seek peace for the departed soul. Moulana Obaidul Haq, MP, led the prayer.

"The country lost a veteran politician and an experienced parliamentarian," said the resolution.

Chowdhury began his career as Mansif but later left the service to join politics in 1954. He was elected to the East Pakistan Provincial Assembly from his home-district. He returned to parliament in 1991 general election from the Rajbari-1 constituency.
