





LONDON, Aug 19: England striker Alan Shearer condemned Premier League favourites Arsenal to their second defeat in two games by

ward again rewarded manager Kenny Dalglish for his massive outlay by grabbing his third goal in two games in the 85th minute of an untidy match. He shouldered aside Jimmy

Carter to take possession 10 yards inside Arsenal's half and raced on to deliver a thunderous effort from 25 yards. which deflected off David Hillier into the top corner of the net.

To add to Arsenal's problems, they lost new signing John Jense, the Danish international, with a facial injury.






