COLOMBO, Aug 19: Shri Lanka piled up their highest Test total smen continued

the close, securing a 291-run first innings lead.

In the 12 overs that Australia faced before stumps were drawn. Mark Taylor and Tom Moody had taken their side to 26 without loss. Australia resume their innings on Friday after Thursday's rest day with a formidable task in

Shri Lanka murdered a tired Australian attack with three batsmen making centuries on a perfect batting strip that is known to be unpredictable on the final two

Shri Lanka surpassed their highest Test total of 497 made in the first innings of the Wellington Test against New Zealand in the 1990-91 series.

This was also the first occasion that three Shri Lankan batsmen — skipper Arjuna Ranatunga, Asanka Gurusinha and Kaluwirthana - had scored centuries in a single innings.

Kaluwirthana also became only the second Shri Lankan, after former wicket-keeper Brendon Kuruppu, to hit a Test ton on his debut.


He scored 132 not out after coming in at the fall of Shri Lanka's fifth wicket at 367. Together with left-hander over before lunch for 127. Asanka Gurusinha, the diminutive stumper put up 96 runs for the next wicket.

Ranatunga and Gurusinha paved the way for Kaluwirthana to run amok, slamming 26 boundaries in his powerpacked 203 minutes' batting that battered the Australian bowling line-up.

Coming in to bat when offspinner Greg Matthews was on a hattrick, the 22-year-old Kaluwirthana showed maturity beyond his years, plundering the runs with and getting off the mark with a boundary.

He reached his century with another, pulling medium pacer Mark Waugh to the mid

Gurusinha scored 137 runs, his highest Test score, in 512 minutes, including 18 bound-



of Ranatunga and Gurusinha continued their merciless onslaught.

Gurusinha for the second straight day proved to be a perfect foil for the batsmen at the other end giving nothing away to the bowlers as he patiently notched up his fourth Test hundred.

Ranatunga played a captain's role smashing his third Test century with three sixes and 17 boundaries before falling to Matthews in the last

Matthews was on a hat-trick after he bowled next man Marvan Atapattu for a duck but Gurushinha and Kaluwirthana took complete control there-

Gurusinha's great innings ended in the penultimate over before tea when he tried to cut a rising ball from Whitney through third man but only succeeded in giving a catch to the prowling out-fielder Dean

Matthews was the most successful bowler for Australia taking three for 93 from a wicket that offered no life to the pace duo of Craig McDermott and Whitney, both of whom finished with two wickets apiece.

Leg-spinner Shane Warne, playing in his third Test match, was badly mauled, his 22 overs costing 107 runs.

AP adds: Shri Lanka's total control over the match so far signals the coming of age for this tiny Indian Ocean island as a cricketing nation.

Long considered the whipping boys of cricket, Shri Lanka have not won a single match in their last 17 Test appearances since 1986. That

It's man against machine

LONDON, Aug 19: An ageing American mathematician is risking his world checkers, or draughts title fighting a computer he knows must one day beat him, reports Reuter.

Dr Marion Tinsley, 65, confronted a computer armed with the Canadian "Chinook" software on Monday in the first round of a two week man-versus-machine struggle for the world checkers title.

Tinsley has played Chinook 18 times before, winning once and drawing the other mate ches. Against humans he has lost only eight times in the past 38 years, keeping his title since 1955.

Chinook is already world number two in checkers.

Their first match on Monday was a draw after five hours. But with the computer programme learning 100 million new checkers positions every day to add to its database of more than 70 billion moves, Tinsley suspects time is run-

ning out. "Will it beat me one day? I'm sure the answer is yes" said Tinsley, sitting at a baizecovered table on which Garri

Kasparov and Anatoly Karpov played for the 1986 chess "It knows all my games", he

Chinook has been developed by a Canadian team led by University of Alberta professor Jonathan Schaeffer as a test bed to explore the potential of computer intelligence to learn and cope with more complex






