# CHT leaders want to participate in govt peace move

RANGAMATI, Aug 21: Tra-ditional tribal leaders of Chittagong Hill Tracts have demanded that they be allowed to participate in the government's peace motivation programme for the early solution the CHT problems, reports

We, the grassroots level leaders, can play a vital role in accelerating the peace process," said Binoy Kumer Dewan, former presidential ad viser on CHT affairs and President of Headman Association, at a press conference here on Thursday.

The Headman Association is an organisation of traditional tribal leaders of the hill districts of Rangamati, Kha grachari and Bandarban.

There are 386 headmen in the three districts, each representing one mouza. They used to collect land revenues on behalf of the government in exchange of 25% commission and Tk 200 as monthly honourarium.

Dewan said since the assassination of President Ziaur Rahman they are being neglected and the government is being deprived of a huge revenue. The payment of their monthly honourarium has also become irregular, he alleged.

He urged the government to pay proper attention to the headmen of CHT, who can help the government in restoring peace in the region besides collecting a substantial amount of revenues for the govern

Criticising the govern ment's afforestation programme in Chittagong Hill Tracts, Dewan said, if implemented, it will render about 1.5 lakh people homeless and aggravate the situation in the

CHT. forestation programme should be started after making proper arrangement for the rehabilitation of those who would be affected by it.

He urged the government to repeal the black ordinance immediately to help maintain democratic atmosphere in the


