Edn to be standardised to check 'brain drain': PM

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia yesterday called upon the teachers and students to extend their all-out cooperation to make the nonformal education programmes like mass education a success, reports BSS.

campus, witnesses said. Among the injured Mohiuddin Kader, 24 and Ilias Babul, 22, were admitted with serious bullet wounds to Chittagong Medical College Hospital, doctor on duty said.

Police said today's gunfight between the two rival groups of JCD activists was the sequel to Tuesday's internecine cam-

The JCD supporters of Chittagong University were divided over a leadership issue among themselves which culminated into a gunfight for the second consecutive day today, police and campus sources said.

During the gunfight this morning both the groups freely exchanged gunshots and plasted crackers in the chase and counter-chase which took place for about an hour, campus sources added saying it sparked off tension there.

Later, police rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control.

Tk 12cr damage suit against Ershad, Rawshan and 3 others

A 12-crore Taka damage suit was filed against former president Hossain Mohammad Ershad, Begum Rawshan Ershad and three others by Antazuddin Ahmed, a renowned businessman and his wife Hosne Ara Ahmed, reports

The plaintiffs in their application said their houses in Gulshan and Dílu Road in Dhaka city were illegally declared abandoned in 1988. The Gulshan House was turned into office of the then first lady Begum Rawshan Ershad and the Dilu Road House was allotted to her relative Monsura Mohi-

Moreover, the application said Antazuddin Ahmed was detained under the Special Powers Act and falsely implicated in a number of criminal cases. This has caused enormental torture.

He was not released from the detention by Ershad government despite order from the High Court on a writ peti-

tion filed by him. This was done as Antazuddin had refused to carry out an illegal order of the former

president, the application said. Hosne Ara Ahmed who is co-owner of the property declared abandoned by the Ershad government is a resident of America.

The other defendants in the case are SM Rahmatullah, exchairman of RAJUK, Mohammad Ali, ex-secretary Ministry of Home and Ayubur Rahman. ex-secretary Ministry of Works.

After hearing both sides, sub-judge of the 1st court Shahidul Haq issued order allowing defence counsels Nitai Roy Chowdhury and Mostafa Jamal to consult Ershad who is now in Dhaka Central Jail in connection with the case.

One hanged in Khulna for killing cousin

KHULNA, Aug 26: A middle-aged man, accused of killing his cousin, was hanged at the district jail here early hours today (Wednesday), reports UNB.

Akil Siddique (40) was hanged at 1:15 am after being sentenced to death by hanging for killing Rahatullah at village in Khadempur Chuadanga of Kushtia district in March, 1985.

District Session Judge of Chuadanga sentenced him to death by hanging on January 28, 1986. The accused then appealed to the High Court and Supreme Court. Both courts rejected the appeal.

The plaintiff then applied to the President for his life but it was also turned down.

Siddique was brought to Khulna district jail from Raishahi, Monday.

This is the second case of hanging in Khulna district jail, the first was in 1985.

private sector. The committee reviewed, in consultation with chambers, tariff values of a number of items and recommended cuts on 30 importables.

Meanwhile, according to sources in the business circles. the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI) has finalised a fresh list of 500 items, tariff values of which are said to be higher than real international price indices.

FBCCI will soon submit the list to the National Board of Revenue (NBR), asking for revision in those cases also, sources said.

Tariff value, set by NBR, reflects the real international price of an importable, and custom duty is determined on the basis of this value. Tariff value is aimed at plugging revenue leakage by restricting over and under-invoicing.

Tariff value has so far been fixed on some 2,300 items. about 60 per cent of the total importables. The values are, however, reviewed and changed, if necessary, every three months.

College student's death triggers violence

Death news of a Dhaka College student triggered violence in the surroundings the college on the Mirpur Road in the city Wednesday.

Furious students started picketing on the road from New Market to Science Laboratory areas from 10 am to 2 pm yesterday. The college authorities declared all classes would remain suspended today (Thursday).

Farhad Hossain, a second year student of science group of Dhaka College was found dead Wednesday. According to family sources,

Farhad was missing since Tuesday. As usual Farhad went to the college from his rest dence at South Kafrul, Dhaka Cantonment Tuesday morning but did not return home, relatives said

In their search for Farhad relatives rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital [DMCH] Wednesday morning and found the body in the A hospital source said, a

rickshaw-puller brought the body to the hospital Tuesday afternoon but the body remained unidentified The body was brought to

the hospital morgue immediately after a clash between a group of students and shop owners and employees of Bakusha Market at Nilkhet Area at around 1:30 pm Tuesday.

The shop owners claimed that the students stormed on them when a tailoring shop

owner of the market refused to pay tolls demanded by the students Tuesday.

On the contrary, the students said that they rushed to the market to rescue some of their fellow students who were assaulted and held captive at the market Tuesday.

On Wednesday the unruly students damaged several rickshaws and cars plying on the roads. They also damaged at least a dozen of road side shops during a demonstration in protest against the killing.

The students also marched towards the Bakusha Market in a procession but police blocked them on the way to avert any fresh violence.

Witnesses said, several armed youths were found roaming in and out side the Bakusha Market Wednesday. Meanwhile, the post


