

Witnesses said the insane man, aged about 30, was standing at the foot of a Krishnachura flower tree, uncon cerned about the campus battle, when he was shot down at about 1:15 pm.

He lay dead on the spot in front of Suryasen Hall of the university for about half an hour before being removed by some ones to DMCH morgue.

THE USS ABOARD INDEPENDENCE, Aug 30: US pilots protecting Shi'ite Muslims from aerial attack said they detected Iraqi aircraft near the "no-fly" zone over southern Iraq, but reported no attempts to enter the embargoed area, reports AP. One of President Saddam

Hussein's Cabinet Ministers said Saturday that Iraq will not be provoked into a military conflict, although the governhas described US President George Bush's flight ban as an aggressive act that could lead to war.

The government will "choose its own time and method for retaliation," said the state radio, after reporting the Cabinet had met under Iraqi Prime Minister to discuss the two-day-old prohibition on Iraqi flights below the 32nd parallel.

On Sunday, the official Iraqi News Agency announced that Saddam would deliver "a historic message" to the nation at 9 pm (1700 GMT).

The statement, Saddam's first since the "no fly" ban want into effect on Thursday, will be broadcast on state-run radio and television.

Pak Defence Minister may come next month to talk military cooperation By Toufique Imrose Khalidi

Pakistan Defence Minister Ghaus Ali Shah is likely to visit Bangladesh sometime in September to discuss military cooperation between the two countries, according to a Pakistani newspaper available in Dhaka Sunday.

Bangladesh officials neither denied nor confirmed the report published in the Aug 16 issue of the Islamabad-based weekly, The News.

The visit (of Ghaus Ali) is not unlikely, but it is yet to be finalised," said an official, preferring anonymity.
