

Training courses for transport workers urged

CHITTAGONG, Aug 30: A seminar on 'Traffic Problems of Chittagong city' was held at the City Corporation Conference Hall, yesterday under the auspices of Rotary Club of Chittagong, reports BSS.

Rotary Club president A H Sufyani presided over the seminar while city mayor Mir Muhammad Nasir Uddin, L K Siddiqui MP, journalist Moyeenul Alam, transport employees representative Minal Chowdhury and the Deputy Commissioner, Traffic Chittagong Metropolitan Police participated in it.

Tk 60 cr electrification project taken up in Cox's Bazar

COX'S BAZAR, Aug 30: The government has taken up a rural electrification programme involving a total cost of Taka 60 crore to expand and develop the electrification network in Cox's Bazar district, reports BSS.

Over 496 villages under 46 unions in 5 thanas namely Ramu, Chakoria, Cox's Bazar, Ukhia and Teknaf would be brought under this programme.

This was stated by Energy and Mineral Resources Minister Dr Khandaker Mosharrat Hossain while visiting the un-

dereconstruction 33/11 KV sub-station of Rural Electrification Board (REB) in Cox's Bazar yesterday. Under the programme, 1500 kilometres new lines would be constructed and 300 kilometres existing old lines developed through building-up three 33/11 KV sub-stations he said.

The programme started in December, 1991 and would be completed by 1997-98. It had been implemented by the financial assistance of World Bank. On completion of the project, 17,986 residential, 420 industrial, 2,957 commercial and 827 irrigation new connections would be provided.

Earlier, the Minister addressed the local PDB officers and employees and called upon them to work sincerely to make PDB commercially viable by reducing system loss to acceptable level and realising arrears bills on time.

He said that the electricity network in Cox's Bazar would have to be developed as its commercial and economic significance.

The present amount of outstanding arrears in Cox's

Hazar is Taka one crore and nine lakh which is equivalent to four and a half month billing.

Chief engineer of Chittagong region M Shamsul Hoq, Executive Engineer (commercial) Omar Faruk, Executive Engineer (operation) Sujit Kumar Chakma and General Manager of REB A K M Rahman were present at the meeting.

Computer training for BCS officials underscored

Education Minister Zamrudin Sircar yesterday underscored the need for computer training for the civil servants to increase their professional efficiency and meet the demand of the time, reports BSS.

He was speaking as the chief guest at the certificate award ceremony to the participants of the second training course on computer for officials of BCS (foreign officers) cadre held at the conference room of the Ministry of Establishment.

The month-long training course was conducted by the Public Administration Computer Centre under the Ministry of Establishment.

Presided over by the Establishment Secretary M Hasnir Rahman the function was also addressed by Additional Secretary of the Ministry SM Akram Hossain and course coordinator Jamilur Rahman Khan.

EPB earns Tk 7587.71 cr
CHITTAGONG, Aug 30: The Export Promotion Bureau (EPB) earned Taka 7,587.71 crore, 99.65 per cent of the target during the fiscal year 1991-92, reports BSS.

The income during the period was more than Taka 1531 crore of the previous year.

Individual targets were achieved in exports of agricultural products, chemical products, engineering goods, readymade garments and other industrial products during the FY 1991-92.
