### Foodgrain output in Barendra project up

CHAPAINAWABAGANJ, Sept 6: Annual production of food grain in the district has been increased by 3.38 lakh tons in the first phase of the Barendra Project, reports UNB.

Project sources said that the annual output of the foodgrains in the project area has gone up from 7.56 lakh tons to 10.94 as a result of extended irrigation facilities.

About 2,84,817 acres of land have been brought under irrigation network during the current season as against 1,29,222 acres last year.

Besides, the massive afforestation programme of the Barendra Project has brought about a considerable climatic change over the area.

According to the same source, the average rainfall rose from 54.99 inches to 62.46 inches in the area in first phase of the project.

It is learnt that after the installation of the projected 3500 deep tubewells, a total of 3.48 lakh acres of land will get irrigation facilities, which will produce additional 7.8 lakh tons of foodgrains annually.

It is hoped that production will substantially reduce the food deficit in the country.
