CHITTAGONG, Sept 7: Nurul Huda, an Assistant Judge of Special Tribunal, on Sunday sentenced Abdul Sukkur and Shamsul Alam to ten years imprisonment each on charge of keeping illegal arms, reports BSS.

The accused persons were found guilty under the arms act.

The prosecution story is that Chandgon Police caught red handed Abdul Sukkur and Shamsul Alam with one country made light gun and some rifle ammunition at Kalamesh Bazar on April 17, 1992. The police filed a case against them.

The judge examined five prosecution witnesses and found the accused persons guilty.

Kafil Uddin appeared on behalf of the state while Advocate Rabul Hussain defended the accused.
