Farhad's killers to be punished: Sircar

Education Minister Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar yesterday assured the teachers and students of Dhaka College that the killers of Farhad Hossain would be identified and punished as per law, reports UNB.

His assurance came when a delegation of teachers and students led by the Principal of the college called on him at the Education Ministry to apprise him of the recent incidents around Dhaka College since the killing.

Students have been staging violent protests since the August 26 killing of Farhad, a second year student of the college. He was beaten to death at Bakushah Hawkers Market.

The minister also assured that the government would take steps for maintaining peace and discipline in the adjoining areas of the college and called upon the students and teachers to extend cooperation in this regard.

Mayor of Dhaka City Corporation Mirza Abbas, Barkatullah Bulu, MP, Education Secretary Shaiful Alam, Additional Secretary Abdullah Haroon Pasha and Joint Secretary Ahmed Hossain were present, said an official handout.

Rly anti-smuggling drive soon

The railway authorities have decided to carry out anti-smuggling drive at some designated stations on Dhaka-Chittagong route to stop movement of smuggled goods through railways, reports BSS.

Eight stations have been designated/identified to carry out the month-long drive in cooperation with BDR, police and railway employees. Railway sources said the decision to start the drive was taken at a joint meeting, held Tuesday at the railway rest house at Akhaura Station in view of recent increase of smuggling on the route. A magistrate of respective districts will lead the drive, the sources added.

The stations identified are Feni, Laksham, Comilla, Akhaura, Brahmanbaria, Bhairabazar, Narsingdi and Kishoreganj. Besides trains on Dhaka-Chittagong routes, other trains arriving at the designated stations will also be thoroughly searched. The members of the raid will board the non-stop Mahanagar express trains and will disembark only at the destination.

The sources said smugglers were loading and unloading goods at different points either by forcing the driver to halt trains at gunpoint or making the signals ineffective, resulting in the stoppage of the trains. A number of railway employees were injured to obstruct smugglers in their nefarious acts, the sources added.

The Akhaura meeting, presided over by Rashidul Alam, Joint Secretary Railway Division, was attended among others by battalion commander of 7th rifle and representatives of Brahmanbaria district administration and police.

Neither the businessmen nor the students have any link with the killers of meritorious student Farhad, federation president Mohammad Helaluddin and general secretary Mohammad Shahabuddin in a statement issued last night opined.

The federation leaders wondered that despite their demand of a neutral investigation into the murder, shops in the city's biggest shopping areas—New Market, Gawsia Market, Noor Mansion, Chishtia Chadnichak etc. remained closed since the killing on August 26 due to tension prevailing at the areas.
