Govt firm to sweep anarchy out: Oli

CHITTAGONG, Sept 11: Communications Minister Oli Ahmed has called upon the members of the teaching community to guide the students to act as a significant force in nation building activities, reports BSS. He was addressing the teachers of Chittagong University who constituted a new forum 'Jatiyatubadi Shikkhak Parishad' at the local Circuit House yesterday. Planning Minister Zahiruddin Khan, Prof Mahbub Ullah, Prof Yusuf Sharif Ahmed Khan, Prof Abul Kalam Azad and Secretary General of Jatiyatubadi Ainjibee Forum-Chittagong unit Advocate Mamoon also spoke on the occasion. State Minister for Religious Affairs Abdul Mannan, Syed Wahidul Alam MP and Sirajul Islam MP were present. Oli said, the government of Begum Khaleeda Zia was committed to root out anarchic activities once for all from educational institutions. It may take time but, insshaallah, we will be able to do it, he said. He called upon the members of Jatiyatubadi Shikkhak Parishad to come with pragmatic proposals so that people could rear the fruits of democracy earned through a ceaseless struggle of nine years against autocracy. Weeklong workshop inaugurated Video, film-making vital for expressing problem

The inauguration of a week-long workshop on video and short films, under the guidance of Didi Danquardt from Germany, was held at the Goethe Institute yesterday. The function was organised by 'Prokishi'. Speaking on the occasion, Mrs. Lechner, the Director of the Goethe Institute, said the German Cultural Centre was pleased that something more would be learnt by the workshop than what was already known in the country. She added that it was high time that professional knowledge of short films and video was promoted and learnt well as it was needed in training, reportage and the spread of knowledge of all types throughout the country. Mrs. Lechner stated, furthermore, that there were 15 participants who had previous experience in video and film making. Numerous cameras are available in Bangladesh, and there are viewing equipments not only in Dhaka, but in other cities of Bangladesh and in the countryside. The NGOs are spreading information through this visual medium where reading and writing is not rampant. She added that this film and video work was based on the traditions of Bangladesh, and that she hoped that the productions, which are today in a preliminary stage, would one day be good enough to be sent abroad. In this manner, she said, the world outside would get to know more about Bangladesh. Manzaer-Haseen, speaking on the occasion, said the participants expected to learn considerably, under the guidance of the German expert, Nargis Banu, also speaking at the function, said that she was pleased to learn from Didi Danquardt, that he was already aware of how politically conscious the people of Bangladesh were. She added that she hoped that an amicable relation would develop during the workshop, and that the participants would learn something worthwhile. Didi Danquardt, the expert himself, who spoke last, commented that he had met a lot of interesting people during his work in Latin America and his visit to New Delhi. He explained that the film and the video work were similar to one another, and that the video and film making medias were vital for expressing problems. The language of documentary through video and short films was even more emphatic than the print media, he stressed.

Two killed in road mishaps

Two persons were killed in two separate road accidents at Kawan bazar and New Airport road in the city in last two days. An unidentified pedestrian was killed when a speeding truck ran over him at about 5:00 am, Friday. He was fatally injured and sent to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where he succumbed to his injury. He was nearly 60. Another unknown pedestrian, was killed when a speeding minibus knocked him at New Airport Road at about 8:00 pm, Thursday. He was sent to DMCH in a critical condition where he died eventually. Both the bodies were sent to the DMCH morgue for autopsy.
