





Light rainfall likely

Light or moderate rain or shower may occur at many places over Chittagong and Khulna divisions and at a few places over Dhaka and Rajshahi divisions during the next 24 hours commencing 6 am today (Saturday).

According to met office forecast, day temperature is likely to remain nearly unchanged over the country. Rainfall activities may decrease after two days, the Met office added.

The country yesterday (Friday) experienced light to moderate rainfalls at most of the places. Chief amounts of rainfall recorded in 12 hours from 6 am to 6 pm yesterday were: Sandwip 113 mm, Sitakund 82 mm, Patuakhali 50 mm, Kutubdia 45 mm, Khepupara 34 mm, Rangamati 29 mm, Feni 28 mm, Bhola 22 mm and other places below 20 mm.

The maximum temperature of 32.4 degree Celsius was reported both from Rajshahi and Dinajpur and the minimum of 22.9 degree from Sylhet yesterday. The sun sets today at 6.05 pm and rises tomorrow at 5.44
