Confere on reproductive health research ends Training of personnel to improve MR suggested

The 12th national conference on reproductive health research ended here Sunday recommending dissemination of knowledge to be eligible couples on different aspects of abortion, menstrual regulation (MR), fertility and use of various contraceptives, reports BSS.

The two-day conference suggested further development of infrastructural facilities in the clinics, adequate and regular supply of equipment and logistics and training of personnel to improve MR and other reproductive services.

It also suggested improvement of supervision and monitoring of family planning services at the field level. The conference was organised by BIRPERHT, a reproductive health research institute.

Speaking as the chief guest at the concluding session Deputy Leader of the Jatiya Sangsad Prof Badruddoza Chowdhury urged the participants to give emphasis on health education of the people to improve primary health care and sanitation with the locally available resources.

He said our indigenous vegetables, fruits and legumes could solve the problem of nutrition and vitamins while daily exposure to sunlight only for an hour could meet the need of vitamin 'D'. About 30 different categories of common drugs could treat 90 per cent of common ailments, he added.

Planning commission member M. Mokammel Haque, Director General of Family Planning AKM Rafiquzzaman and Director of BIRPERHT Dr Halida Hanum Akhter also spoke. Health and Family Welfare Secretary Syed Ahmed presided.

In a number of recommendations the conference suggested low dose oral pills for the newly married women, reintroduction of Copper T 200 contraceptive, an Inter Urinal Device (IUD) instead of Copper T 300, and further study on Norplant, a new contraceptive, before inclusion in the family planning programme.

It also suggested research to identify mechanism to strengthen supervision and logistic supply of family planning services, prevention of successive pregnancy to prevent malnutrition and national survey to study anaemia of pregnant women.

Director General of Family Planning AKM Rafiquzzaman said some complaints were reported in the use of Copper T 300 which was given free by the donors.

Referring to Norplant he said it would be made available to the clinics only on demand.

Kamal off to Kathmandu

Health and Family Welfare Minister Chowdhury Kamal Ibne Yusuf left Dhaka yesterday for Kathmandu to attend the 10th meeting of the Ministers of Health of the south-east Asia region commencing today, reports BSS.

The Health Minister was accompanied by the Director General Health services Prof Dr M A T Siddique.

The Health Ministers of south-east region comprising Bangladesh, Bhutan, North Korea, India, Indonesia, Maldives, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, Sri Lanka and Thailand are attending the conference.

The topics to be discussed at the conference are the progress in the implementation of the recommendations of the 9th meeting of Ministers of Health, trends in the communicable diseases such as AIDS, malaria and cholera, public mix in delivery on health care, and primary health care.

New fertilizer factory to be built at Fenchuganj

A new fertilizer factory will be constructed at Fenchuganj, Sylhet with a production capacity of between one lakh 80 thousand and 3 lakh 30 thousand tons, reports BSS.

The proposed factory, to be named Jalalabad Fertilizer Factory, will replace the existing Natural Gas Fertilizer Factory which has a production capacity of one lakh tons.

Steps had been taken to form a new company under the name of Jalalabad Fertilizer Company, a Bangladesh Chemical Industries Corporation (BCIC) press release said in Dhaka yesterday.

The BCIC said that a proforma for the factory had already been submitted to the Planning Commission for formal approval and BCIC experts were preparing the tender documents.

The press release said the Economic Relations Division of the government was looking for possible external finance for the project. It also that foreign contractors would be appointed for the work and the project was expected to be completed by the first part of the next fiscal year.

Commitment team meets Biswas

A ten-member delegation of Commitment, a voluntary organisation met President Abdur Rahman Biswas at Bangabhaban Saturday, according to a press release, reports BSS.
