Shri Lanka after negotiating their way to a safe draw in the final Test before a packed Tyronne Fernando S'adium here Sunday, reports

Greg Matthews hit a patient 96 to take the limelight on the final day as Australia opted to continue their second innings until the match was called off 20 minutes before the scheduled close when Matthews was finally dismissed.

Australia at this stage were 271 for eight- a strong recovery from their four wickets down for nine runs at one stage on the fourth day.

Heavy rains Sunday, however, dampened hopes of a decision on the last day, which eventually vanished completely after Australian skipper Allan Border decided to allow his overnight pair of Matthews and lan Healy to continue past

His decision dismayed a 10,000-strong home crowd who had expected a challenging declaration at the break But with three hours of play already ruined by rain and with the series 1-0 in Australia's favour, the visitors were clearly not willing to take chances.




