Bold move, needs bolder follow-up

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia is said to be under pressure from two opposite camps from within the BNP about the possible course of aetion in containing terrorism and violence by armed cadres belonging to the two factions of BNP's student wing, the Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD). One group is advising her to call off the police action, or at least not to push it further than it has so far gone, and confine her future actions against JCD stalwarts to party disciplinary measures. Their argument is that public discrediting of leaders of JCD will in turn discredit BNP itself. which may harm the party's long term interests. Pro-

ponents of this view say that JCD is the most popular and active wing of the BNP and taking tough actions against them may send wrong signals to the student leaders at the district and lower levels.
