The Association has already served a notice to the National Book Centre for immediate payment of Taka about 50 lakh as arrear bills, which have been accumulated over the

Osman Ghani, Secretary of the Standing Committee, said that the Association might stop supply of books of the centre or go for other tougher actions if it fails to ensure payments within next 10 days.

Out of seven thousand members of the Bangladesh Book publishers and Sellers Association, the Standing Committee on creative literature consists of more than one hundred publishers. They alleged that the non-payment of arrear bills by the National Book Centre has been causing acute problem in publishing creative literature.
