Govt plotting to hinder student politics: GCO

The Ganatantrik Chhatra Oikya (GCO) leaders yesterday alleged that the government was framing new plots to hinder the student politics in the country.
The leaders called upon the student community to stand against terrorism, communalism and conspiracies.
In observance of the Education Day yesterday the GCO leaders at a grand rally held at the Dhaka University campus warned the government and vested quarters not to conspire against the students' movement.
Begum Khaleida Zia and her government will have to face the same fate as that of Ershad if fails to realise demands of the student and to root out terrorism from the educational institutions.
GCO leaders termed the Anti-terrorism Ordinance as a

black law and said it would harass the people.
The rally held in front of the Arts Building was addressed by the GCO leaders Abu Aslam Mintu, Abdus Sattar Khan, Razequzzaman Ratan, Mukhlesur Rahman, Ahad Ahmed, Bidhan Roy, Ragib Ahsan Munna while Nasir Ud Doza took the chair.
Addressing they rally the leaders urged the students to go for a vigorous movement to press home the students' ten point charter of demand.
The leaders alleged that the government was sheltering the terrorists of Jamaat-Shibir, Freedom Party and demanded arrest and trial of the Freedom Party leaders.
Nasir Ud Doza in his speech said that the main demand and expectation of the 1962 student movement was not materialised. He mentioned

that the present government also is yet to take any step in realising the students' 10 point demand even after one year of achieving democracy.
The government was patronising the 'razakers' who were hatching plots of violence in the country, Nasir alleged and demanded their punishment.
The GCO leader Bidhan Roy said the present education system and facilities were only for the children of the capitalist class, not for the masses.
They criticised the move to establish Private University and added, that it would make education a business which was suitable for elite class.
Mentioning the education policy the GCO leaders said that the students would not compromise with any decision if that failed to fulfil the students' demands.

'Rats destroy 4.5 lakh tonnes of rice a year'

Agriculture and Irrigation, Water Development and Flood Control Minister Major General (ret'd) M. Majid ul Haq yesterday formally inaugurated the Rat Control Programme of current aman season at BARC auditorium in the city reports BSS.

Organised by Bangladesh Agriculture Extension Department, Agriculture Secretary ANM Eusuf and Director General, Department of Agriculture Extension Dr M Ayubur Rahman also spoke on the occasion.
The Agriculture Minister said Rat Control Programme must be made successful to attain the goal of earning self-sufficiency in food. The Minister said that near about 4 and a half lacs in tons of rice and other food grains are being destroyed by rats per year.

Gen Haq emphasised on avoidance of traditional rat controlling process and instructed all concerned to take initiatives to teach and widely circulate rat control methods among the farmers.
The Minister distributed prizes among the best rat killers of different agricultural extension workers, farmers, members of volunteer organizations and educational institutions.
A total of 10 lacs and 30 thousands of rats were killed during last years programme and nearly eight thousand metric tons of foodgrains were saved from it.
