The agriculture minister said that the country had been able to remove the notion of " international basket case" by its record in the third world achieving near food self-sufficiency. Paying tributes to the resilience of the farmers, he said, the bankers and international donor agencies have collaborated with us in our efforts to achieve this remarkable success in food produc-

The minister urged the banker to prepare the agricultural loan recovery calender suiting to the farmers' repaying capabilities at the post harvest period so that the collection of the banks money could be maximized without

causing any hardship to the farmers.

Pointing to the agricultural inputs and subsidy issues. Huq said that as most of the Bangladeshi farmers were now living below the poverty line, the government could not withdraw the subsidies at a

He said even in the United States and in European countries there were agricultural subsidies. But we have to remove it as part of our efforts to stand on our own feet, he added. U S Ambassador Milam also

lauded the success of the Bangladeshi farmers to near materialise the long-standing dream of food self-sufficiency in the country.

Milam said the private sector in Bangladesh would have to go a long way for the rapid industrialization and green revolution.

Fish output falls in Barguna

BARGUNA, Sept 19: Fish production in the district is decreasing gradually due to various reasons causing inconveniences to the local people. reports UNB.

Fisheries department sourees said the district is facing a shortage of about 6000 metric tons of fish annually whereas average yearly fish production stands at only 5000 metric tons

They said annual fish production could be increased upto 10,000 metric tons by introducing scientific methods. Lack of excavation and re-

excavation of ponds, unplanned construction of dams and sluice gates and indiscriminate catching of fish fry with current nets are main reasons behind the decline in fish out-

Local people complained that some unscrupulous fishermen are catching fish fry with current nets defying government ban.

Experts also said fish production has been decreasing sharply due to feeble waterflow in the rivers Paira and Bishkhali.

Sources said that only 50 per cent of the government and private ponds here have been brought under fish culti-

According to a survey, waterbodies in the district include 10,000 ponds of which 350 are under government control and there are four rivers and 30 beels. About 5000 families are dependent on fishing occupation.

Fishermen of the district complained that they are also facing problems due to scarcity of fishing materials and nonavailability of loans on easy terms.

They further alleged that no initiative has so far been taken by the authorities to train them up in scientific piscicul-
