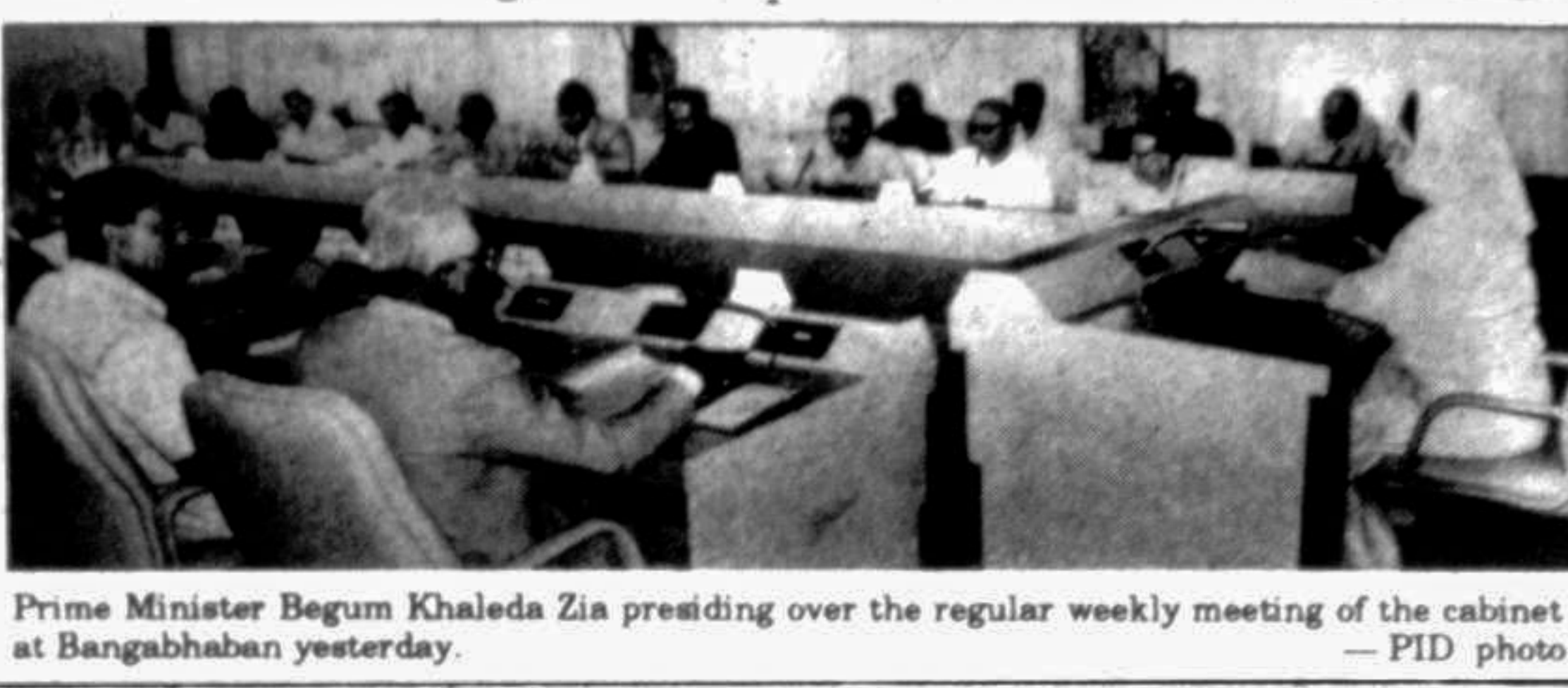
Tea for flood victims in Pakistan

The government has decided to send tea worth Taka 20 lakh as gift from the people of Bangladesh to their flood affected brethren in Pakistan, reports BSS.

According to an official announcement in Dhaka Monday the consignment is expected to be despatched soon.

Earlier Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia sent a message to the Prime Minister of Pakistan Muhammad Nawaz Sharif expressing condolence and sympathy of the people and government of Bangladesh on the loss of lives and properties due to severe floods and landslides in Pakistan.

Begum Khaleda Zia talked to Sharif over telephone to personally convey Bangladesh's concern at the worsening flood situation in Pakistan.

Speaker calls on Chinese President

Speaker of the Jatiya Sangsad Shaikh Razzaque Ali and member of the visiting Bangladesh parliamentary delegation Monday called on the Chinese President Yang Shangkun in Beijing, according to a report received in Dhaka, reports BSS.

He conveyed the warm greetings of President Abdur Rahman Biswas and Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia to the Chinese President during the meeting.

The leader of Bangladesh parliamentary delegation referred to the existing bilateral relations between Bangladesh and China and hoped that it would grow further to the mutual benefit of the two countries. During the meeting, President Yang Shangkun recalled the age-old ties between Bangladesh and China and expressed his confidence that this kind of visits would further cement the ties of cooperation and understanding between the two countries.

More NGO-govt cooperation sought to combat tuberculosis

A day-long workshop on 'role of NGOs in national tuberculosis control programme' was inaugurated in Dhaka Monday with a call for increased cooperation between the government and the NGOs for the success of the programme, reports BSS.

Deputy Leader of the Jatiya Sangsad Prof A Q M Badruddoza Chowdhury, while inaugurating the workshop said that the NGOs and the government should coordinate with each other in making the country-wide programme a success.

Health and Family Welfare Minister Chowdhury Kamal Ibne Yusuf, Health and Family Welfare Secretary Syed Ahmed, Director General of Health Services Prof M A T Siddique, WHO representative Dr A N A Abeyaunder, Charge d'Affaires of Danish Embassy Krued Kjaer Nielsen, Chief Public Health Officer of World Bank Resident Mission Dr Phillip R S Gowers and Secretary General of NATAB Dr Sakhawat Hossain, spoke on the occasion.

Dr A K Md Ahsan Ali, director of Micro-bacterial Disease Control (MBDC), presided over the workshop which was jointly organised by MBDC and NATAB.

Prof Chowdhury said, the NGOs have to come in a big way in combatting tuberculosis adding "we can not solve the problem without helping each other."

Regarding government policy in combating the disease, the Deputy Leader of the House said it was an avowed policy of the government to provide modern and best treatment to the patients. It is a right of every citizen of the country to get better treatment," he said.

Prof Chowdhury said maximum emphasis should be given on health education so that people living in rural areas could know about the disease and seek treatment.

He said "inadequate treatment can be worse than no treatment at all" adding there should not be any drop out of patients while undergoing treatment without complete cure.

The Health Minister said the government was committed to the goal of Health for All by 2000 AD. "Government intends to achieve this goal," he added.

Explaining the government policy, Chowdhury Kamal Ibne Yusuf said it had taken an ambitious programme which began in June this year and would continue for four to five years.

He said the NGOs would come forward and coordinate with the government adding "government alone can not deliver the goods." He assured all government help to the NGOs in this regard.

The organisers said tuberculosis had been identified as the second killer disease of the country.

According to the latest survey report there are 45 lakh tuberculosis cases in the country of which 5.7 lakh cases are infectious. These patients are discharging micro-bacterium tuberculosis through coughing, sneezing and creating another 1.5 lakh new cases each year.

Dhaka firm to strengthen regional ties to gear up SACEP : Noman

Environment and Forest Minister Abdullah Al Noman yesterday said that there should be a stronger regional cooperation to combat environmental degradation and Bangladesh is committed to strengthen the regional cooperation for revitalising the South Asian Cooperative Environment Programme, according to a message received in Dhaka, reports BSS.

He was addressing the fifth meeting of the Governing Council of South Asian Cooperative Environment Programme (SACEP), inaugurated in Colombo yesterday by Sri Lankan President Rana Singha Premadasa. Noman, who was elected Vice-Chairman at the meeting, said environmental concern at the national level was now maturing into a regional concern.

He said that all over the world regional bodies were being formed to reach the benefit of cooperation among neighbouring countries and SACEP would be an outstanding example of cooperation among the South Asian countries in prudent managements of environment.

Referring to the Earth Summit held in Brazil last June, the Minister said that the underlying concept of the conference was 'mankind is a family and that certain actions are needed so that mankind is not threatened.'

Stressing on the regional cooperation to combat environmental degradation Noman said that Bangladesh is strongly committed to the concept of regional cooperation and added we cooperate in every possible way to revitalise the South Asian Cooperative Environment Programme.

He observed that alleviation of poverty is the first priority to achieve healthy environment in the developing countries. In this connection he said that Bangladesh supports the idea that SACEP may work in close cooperation with SAARC to avoid unnecessary duplication of environment related programme.

'Bastees den of miscreants'

CHITTAGONG, Sept 21: Wollullah Benu, ex municipal commissioner today called upon concerned authorities to demolish what he called unauthorised bastees (slum) erected on railway lands adjacent to railway station colony and ice factory, reports BSS.

Addressing a press conference at a city hotel he said the bastees had been turned into a den of miscreants, terrorists and other drug addicts and as such the area should be cleared of these anti-social elements. He said the environment around the area had been vitiated because of the existence of the criminal den.

He alleged that a good number of terrorists, hijackers and drug addicts operate most of the crimes from the bastees where they store their illegal arms and other deadly weapons.
